## 2014-15SEASONPREVIEW

The 2014-15 season marks the 12th under the direction of head coach MaChelle Joseph and the 40th year of Georgia Tech women's basketball. The Yellow Jackets return six letterwinners and three starters from last year's squad that recorded the seventh 20-win season and seventh NCAA Tournament appearance under Coach Joseph. Tech welcomes six freshmen to this year's team that are a part of Prospect Nation's 11th ranked recruiting class.

## APPROACHING MILESTONES

Coach Joseph enters her 12th season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets with a career record of 213-134. Joseph is 11 wins away from becoming the all-time winningest coach in Georgia Tech history. Former coach Agnus Berenato is currently the all-time winningest coach with a record of 223-209 in 15 seasons.

Two Yellow Jackets are closing in on 1,000 career points. Senior Sydney Wallace has 831 career points putting her 169 points shy from becoming the 27th Yellow Jacket to achieve the feat. Sophomore Kaela Davis has 594 career points, which makes her 406 points away from 1,000. Davis has played in 32 career games. The record for the fastest player to reach 1,000 points is 55 games.

Georgia Tech has 588 program wins, putting them 12 wins away from reaching the 600 win milestone.

## RETURNING TO THE FLATS

The Yellow Jackets look to be led by Davis, who was a member of the 2014 All-ACC Second team and the 2014 All-ACC Freshman Team. Davis set the single season scoring record for a freshman in Georgia Tech history with 594 points last season, which ranks third on GT's all-time list for points in a single season. Davis led all ACC rookies last season with 18.6 points per game and was honored as the ACC Rookie of the Week four times.

Georgia Tech returns five of its top six scorers and 62 percent of scoring from 2013-14. Davis and Wallace are two of the top returning scorers. Davis averaged 18.6 points per game and led the team with 853 -pointers made. Wallace averaged 9.8 points per game and made 49 3-pointers.

Junior Roddreka Rogers was one of the strongest rebounders on the team last season, averaging 6.6 boards per game. She returns in the post along with junior center Nariah Taylor. Rogers and Taylor had the highest field goal percentage, with Rogers shooting 56.2 percent and Taylor at 52.9 percent.

Junior Aaliyah Whiteside had a stellar sophomore season, averaging 7.8 points per game and 5.3 rebounds per game and the Jackets look to use her in both a guard and forward role this upcoming season. Sophomore Katarina Vuckovic averaged 3.3 points and 2.4 rebounds per game during her freshman campaign last season.

## FRESH FACES

Georgia Tech welcomes six freshmen to this year's team. Center Simina Avram (Brasov, Romania), point guard Imani Tilford (Greenburgh, N.Y.), forwards De’Ashia Jones (Newark, N.J.), Zaire O'Neil (Newark, N.J.), Erin Garner (Philadelphia, Pa.) and guard Antonia Peresson (Pordenone, Italy) make up Georgia Tech's freshmen class that was ranked 11th in the nation by Prospect's Nation. O'Neil and Jones were both teammates at Malcolm Shabazz High School where they led Shabazz to two Tournament of Champions Titles and a \#4 ranking in the nation in the USA Today Super 25 Rankings.

Garner played for Trenton Catholic Academy, breaking her school's record for most blocks in a season and playing a critical part in Trenton Catholic's run to the Non-Public B Championship in 2013.

Tilford graduated as the all-time leading scorer for both girls and boys at Woodlands High School, and was named the MVP and the Journal News' Player of the Year in 2014.

Presson won a bronze medal this past summer during the 2014 U20 European Championship with the Italian national team and won the Italian U19 Championships in 2013 with Reyer Venezia. Avram competed this summer at the 2014 U20 Division B Championship with her home country of Romania and placed second in the national championship with Brasov U23 team.

## MEDIA CREDENTIALS FOR HOME GAMES

Media credentials are issued to accredited members of the working media only. Working space is limited, and children, spouses and other non-workers will not be granted credentials or access to media areas.

Media seating and workspace at McCamish Pavilion is in the upper level, section 211, and the media entrance to the arena is through the west entrance off of Fowler Street. Media will call is located at the ticket booth by the west entrance.

Requests for credentials should be made in writing via email at least 24 hours in
advance of each game to Brittany McCormick. Credentials will not be mailed. They can be picked up the night of the game at the media entrance.

Photo credentials are granted to still photographers and videographers on assignment for a media agency only. Admission to courtside is by FLOOR or PHOTO pass only, and photographer positions are at the discretion of the basketball game officials and the media relations staff.

## DIRECTIONS TO MCCAMISH PAVILION AND THE ZELNAK CENTER

Going South on I-75: Take exit 250 (16th/14th/10th Streets) and follow through light at 14th Street. Stay to the right and follow to 10th Street, where McCamish Pavilion is straight ahead. Turn right to access the parking areas other than the main arena lot.

Going South on I-85: Take exit 84 (17th/14th/10th Streets). You will stay to the left immediately upon exiting the interstate, but will need to move to the right after 16th Street. Follow until you reach 10th Street where McCamish Pavilion will be in front of you. Take a right on 10th Street and an immediate left on Fowler Street and access the main arena parking lot off of 8th Street.

Going North on I-75/85: Take the 10th Street exit (250). Turn left on 10th Street and after you cross the bridge, McCamish Pavilion will be on your left. Just past the arena, turn left at Fowler Street (first traffic light). Take first left at 8th Street and follow to main arena parking lot.

## NCAAINFRACTIONS

In July of 2011, the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Committee on Infractions found the Georgia Institute of Technology men's basketball and football programs responsible for committing violations of NCAA legislation.

The Institute was cited for a lack of cooperation during the investigation, a failure to meet the conditions and obligations of membership, and preferential treatment violations. Also cited were additional violations in the men's basketball program related to the conduct of a nonscholastic men's basketball tournament on campus. The NCAA public report further details all of the findings.
Penalties Included:

- Public reprimand and censure.
- Four years of probation from July 14, 2011 through July 13, 2015.
- $A \$ 100,000$ financial penalty.
- A reduction of two men's basketball recruiting days during the 2011 summer evaluation period (self-imposed by the Institute).
- A limit of 10 official visits for the men's basketball program for the 2011-12 and 2012-


## 13 academic years, respectively.

Vacation of contests won by the football team during the 2009 season after November 24 , which is when the university was alerted to potential eligibility issues.

Additionally, in September of 2014 the NCAA Division I Committee on Infractions cited the Institute for a failure to monitor recruiting activities, and the football, men's basketball, and women's basketball programs were cited for recruiting violations surrounding impermissible telephone calls and text messages sent to prospective student-athletes. The NCAA accepted the Institute's self-imposed penalties. The NCAA public report further details all of the findings. Penalties Included:

- Public reprimand and censure.
- Two additional years of probation, extending through July 13, 2017.
- Recruiting restrictions during the 201213 academic year, including telephone call restrictions and a reduction in off-campus recruiting opportunities (self-imposed by the Institute).

As a result of the exhaustive investigation and review process and because of Georgia Tech's steadfast commitment to compliance, the Institute completely revamped and enhanced its athletics compliance operation and staffing. A robust monitoring system was implemented and a more frequent and meaningful rules education program was established across all sports. The Institute remains committed to operating all of its athletics programs within the letter and spirit of NCAA, ACC, and Institute rules and regulations.

## WOMEN'SBASKETBALL MACHELLE JOSEPH

Head Coach | 12th Season | Purdue '92<br>Record at Georgia Tech: 213-134 | ACC: 80-84<br>Seven NCAA Tournaments | Seven 20-Win Seasons

MaChelle Joseph has taken the Georgia Tech women's basketball program to new heights, has compiled a 213-134 overall record and has the highest overall and ACC winning percentage of any Tech coach in program history. She completed her 11th season at the helm of the Yellow Jackets in 2013-14 as only the second coach in school history to win 200 career games.

When she was named head coach on May 19, 2003, Joseph said that it was her goal to make the Yellow Jackets a national power in women's basketball.

During the 2013-14 season, the Yellow Jackets completed their seventh 20 -win season in the past eight years under Coach Joseph. The Jackets also received their seventh at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament under Coach Joseph. Tech finished the season at 20-12 and seventh in the ACC with a 9-7 conference record.

Prior to the 2013-14 season, Joseph signed high school AllAmerican and the number one recruit in the country, Kaela Davis. Davis, along with senior Tyaunna Marshall, helped the Jackets average 79.7 points per game in 2013-14 - the highest scoring average for a team under Coach Joseph. Marshall became the all-time leading scorer in school history and the first Jacket to score 2,000 points. She finished her career with 2,109 points and was named to the All-ACC First Team, ACC All-Defensive Team and the Georgia College Women's Player of the Year by the Atlanta Tipoff Club for the second consecutive year.

Davis was honored on the All-ACC Second Team and ACC AllFreshman Team. Davis was the fourth-straight All-ACC Freshman Team honoree and sixth overall under Coach Joseph.

The 2012-13 season had some growing pains as Tech finished 14-16, but a number of the young Jackets earned valuable experience that will significantly help in the coming seasons.

Tyaunna Marshall was the brightest star on the Yellow Jackets all season as the junior earned All-ACC First Team, ACC All-Defensive Team, Associated Press honorable mention All-America and WBCA honorable mention All-America honors. Sophomore Sydney Wallace continued to show flashes of scoring brilliance, while freshmen Roddreka Rogers and Aaliyah Whiteside stepped into the starting lineup and were significant contributors in their first year on the Flats.

The 2011-12 season was just the latest step in taking the Jackets
to new heights as Tech won a school-record 26 games, played in just the second ACC Championship Game in school history and advanced to the program's first NCAA Sweet 16.

The 2011-12 season marked Tech's sixth consecutive season and ninth overall with at least 20 wins. The 2012 season culminated in the Jackets' sixth straight NCAA Tournament berth, the eighth in program history.

The 2012 senior class not only finished their careers with the most wins of any class, 95 , and with the most ACC wins of any class, 37 , but all five graduated in four years from Georgia Tech.

Sasha Goodlett became the second WNBA First Round draft pick and seventh overall draftee Joseph has coached when she was selected by the Indiana Fever with the 11th overall pick of the 2012 WNBA Draft.

The 2010-11 season saw the Yellow Jackets top a number of school records. Georgia Tech won a program-best 24 games and Joseph led her squad to a school-record 13-game winning streak, including a 71-70 win over No. 8 North Carolina in Atlanta in which the Jackets rallied from down seven with 1:06 to play. Tech again returned to the NCAA Tournament, earning a No. 5 seed, the school's highest ever. The Jackets defeated Bowling Green in the first round, only the third NCAA Tournament win ever, before falling to Ohio State in a second round game played in Columbus.

Alex Montgomery earned Second Team All-ACC and ACC AllDefensive accolades, while Tyaunna Marshall was named Third Team All-ACC, ACC All-Freshman Team and Third Team Freshman All-America by the Full Court Press.

Joseph earned her 150th career victory on Feb. 24, 2011 with a 64-57 win at No. 13 North Carolina, marking the first time Georgia Tech swept the Tar Heels since the 1990-91 season, and becoming the fastest coach in school history to win 150 games.

Following the season, Montgomery was selected No. 10 overall by the New York Liberty in the 2011 WNBA Draft, the first ACC player drafted in 2011 and became Tech's highest drafted player and first first round draft pick. Montgomery is the fifth Yellow Jacket to be selected in the WNBA draft. During her eight seasons on the Flats, Joseph has coached 18 All-ACC honorees, three ACC All-Freshman team members, five ACC All-Defensive team selections, three ACC All-Academic team members and the 2010 ACC Sixth Player of the Year.

Joseph helped her 2009-10 team to a record-setting season in her seventh on the Flats. She led her squad to a 23-10 mark, tying the most wins in program history and most since joining the ACC prior to the 1979-80 season. Her team reached its fourth straight NCAA Tournament. The year was marked by the development of Brigitte Ardossi, who registered one of the best senior seasons in program history. She earned All-ACC second team honors and become just the fifth Yellow Jacket to be drafted when the Atlanta Dream selected her in the second round. Montgomery earned her second straight All-ACC third team nod and was selected the ACC Sixth Player of the Year.

In her sixth season, Joseph once again led her team to a 22-10 record and led it to the program's third straight NCAA Tournament appearance despite listing 10 freshmen and sophomores on the roster. Tech found itself in the national rankings for five consecutive weeks during the season. The team registered wins over three ranked opponents during the regular season, including a 66-62 win over No. 2/3 North Carolina, the highest ranked opponent ever defeated by a Yellow Jacket team. The Jackets also earned the program's second NCAA Tournament victory when they defeated lowa in the first round of the tournament, 76-62.

The 2007-08 campaign was another successful season with Joseph at the helm. The Jackets finished with a 22-10 record, registering the most wins in program history since joining the ACC before the 1979-80 season. Tech also made its second straight NCAA Tournament appearance, another first for the Yellow Jacket program. The Jackets' play earned them a national ranking of No. 23 in both the AP and ESPN/Coaches Polls during the week of Jan. 21, 2008, the team's first national ranking in 14 years. Two Jackets earned All-ACC honors and senior Chioma Nnamaka became the highest-ever Yellow Jacket taken in the WNBA draft, when she was selected 21st overall.

In her fourth year at Tech, Joseph again took the program to new heights. She coached the Jackets to a 21-12 finish, the best in school history, and the program's first NCAA Tournament win, a 55-54 thriller over DePaul. The Jackets also earned their firstever winning record in ACC play, including wins over defending national champions and fourth-ranked Maryland and Sweet 16 participant NC State. Tech's 9-5 ACC record was seven wins better than the previous season and was the second-best turnaround in conference history.

Once again, Joseph proved to be one of the best recruiting coaches in the nation when she brought in the eighth-ranked recruiting class, featuring forwards Alex Montgomery and Iasia Hemingway, guards Deja Foster, Shaday Woolcock and Simone Trice. Montgomery became the then-highest-ranked recruit to ever sign a letter of intent when the 15th-ranked player chose Tech during the early signing period.

Joseph's third season at the helm of the program proved to be one of her most successful, both on and off the court. While the Jackets again finished just one game shy of postseason qualification, Georgia Tech earned its first ACC Tournament
victory under Joseph and came within five points of recording a quarterfinal victory in the conference tournament against the eventual national champion Maryland. Joseph had two players earn their degrees the following May, and another to be selected in the WNBA draft.

In 2005, Joseph guided a young Yellow Jacket team to a 13-14 record, with the top victory of the season coming against Georgia Tech's arch rival, Georgia, by a score of 55-49 at Alexander Memorial Coliseum. It marked the first time since the 1998-99 season that the Yellow Jackets had defeated a team ranked in the top-10, and the highest ranked team Tech had recorded a victory against since the 1991-92 season, as the Bulldogs were ranked sixth in the nation entering the contest.

Joseph's first recruiting class as the head coach at the Institute, the 2004-05 freshman class, was ranked the No. 5 recruiting class in the nation by the All Star Girls Report in USA Today in November, 2003. Included in that group were high school AllAmericans Jill Ingram, Daphne Mitchell and Janie Mitchell, with Giuliett Ancora, Shantrell Moss and Chioma Nnamaka rounding out her first recruiting class.

Joseph acquired a program that she helped take to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in a decade and just the second time in school history when she was named the Yellow Jackets' head coach prior to the 2003-04 season. During her first season, Joseph tied the records for most overall and conference victories by a first-year head coach, tying her predecessor, Agnus Berenato, who left the Flats to become head coach at Pittsburgh after 15 seasons in the same post at Georgia Tech.

Joseph's skill as a recruiter translated into immediate results at Georgia Tech, where she assembled the then highest-rated freshman class in school history. Tech's 2002 recruiting class, which included McDonald's and WBCA prep All-American Kasha Terry, as well as Ashley Guerrant, Megan Harpring, April Johnson, Jessica Williams and Mallorie Winn, was rated among the top-15 in the nation by a number of recruiting services and media outlets, including No. 11 by the All-Star Girls Report as the second-highest in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Following two years as an assistant coach under Berenato, during which the Yellow Jackets averaged 18 wins a season, Joseph was named the fifth head coach in the history of the Georgia Tech program by former Institute President Dr. G. Wayne Clough and then-Director of Athletics Dave Braine.
"I felt like I won the lottery when I took this job," said Joseph. "This is one of the best jobs in the country and there is no reason why we can't challenge for an ACC and national championship in the years to come. We have all of the resources, the support of our administration and everything that it takes to be a top-10 program, and that is my goal for Georgia Tech."

Braine said that rewarding Joseph with her first head coaching position was a logical choice.

"MaChelle has proven herself to be an outstanding coach and recruiter in her 11 years as an assistant coach, and in particular in her two years at Georgia Tech," Braine said at the time of her promotion.

Tech's former athletic director, Dan Radakovich, showed support in Joseph's vision and awarded her with a contract extension that will keep her at Georgia Tech through the 2014-15 season. "MaChelle has certainly ratcheted up the program in a number of ways," Radakovich said. "She and her staff have worked extremely hard in recruiting, coaching and in gaining awareness in the city of Atlanta. This is definitely a program on the rise."

Prior to her hiring as an assistant before the 2001-02 season, the Yellow Jackets hadn't won 20 games in the same season since the 1992 WNIT Championship season, and hadn't finished at .500 or above in conference play since 1993.

In her two years as Tech's top assistant coach, Joseph applied her skills as an instructor and recruiter along with her all-star playing credentials to help the program enjoy two of the best seasons in its history.

Joseph arrived on the Flats after serving as an assistant coach and the recruiting coordinator on Joe Ciampi's staff at Auburn from 1997-2001. She helped guide the Tigers to a combined 97-50 record in five seasons and the second round of the NCAA Tournament on three occasions. Each of the last four recruiting classes she helped attract to Auburn were ranked in the top-10 nationally by the All Star Girls Report, including the Tigers' 2001 class that was ranked the nation's second-best.

Before joining the Auburn staff, Joseph coached at her alma mater, Purdue, from 1994-96 under Lin Dunn and helped the Boilermakers post a sterling 73-24 (.753) record in three seasons. Purdue advanced to the Final Four in 1994 and followed that performance with a trip to the NCAA Elite Eight in 1995. Joseph also served one year (1993) as an assistant at Illinois.

Overall, Joseph's career as an assistant coach spanned 11 years in three of the nation's top women's basketball conferences, with successful stops at Auburn of the Southeastern Conference, as well as Purdue and Illinois of the Big Ten preceding her Atlantic Coast Conference stint. In 15 seasons as a collegiate player and assistant coach, Joseph was a part of programs that produced winning records in every year but one, and reached the NCAA Tournament 11 times.

A four-year starter for the Boilermakers from 1989-1992, Joseph is one of the most decorated players in Purdue and Big Ten Conference history as she garnered numerous conference and national accolades. After earning Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors as well as second-team all-conference accolades in 1989, Joseph was a first-team All-Big Ten selection in 1990, 1991 and 1992 and was named the Big Ten Player of the Year as a senior. She also earned Kodak All-America honors in 1992, when she was tabbed the Women's Basketball News' College Player of the Year.

She finished her career first on the Big Ten all-time scoring list and was the only player in conference history to rank in the top10 in both points and assists. Joseph helped the Boilermakers reach the NCAA Tournament all four years, including the school's first appearance in 1989 and a pair of trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1990 and 1992. Joseph was inducted in to the Purdue Intercollegiate Hall of Fame on Sept. 24, 2010, and was named one of Purdue's "Legends of Mackey" in January 2012.

A native of Auburn, Ind., Joseph graduated from Purdue in 1992 with a bachelor's degree in movement and sports science.

Assistant Coach | 2nd Season | Georgia Tech '11

A standout Yellow Jacket during her playing days, helping Georgia Tech reach unprecedented heights in women's basketball, Deja Foster begins her second season as an assistant coach with Georgia Tech in 2014-15.

In her first season in her new role, the Yellow Jackets recorded a 20-win season (20-12) and were named a \#10 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Foster finished her career in 2011 as half of the then-winningest class in Yellow Jacket history. Foster, who was hired as a graduate manager in May, earned her degree in business management from Georgia Tech in 2011. The Memphis, Tenn., native became just the second Yellow Jacket to ever receive the Charles T. Stoner Law Scholarship from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.
"I am very excited to add Deja Foster to our women's basketball staff," Joseph said. "Deja was one of the toughest players I ever coached. Her work ethic and desire to be successful on the court and in the classroom were unparalleled. She is a tremendous role model for our student-athletes and the epitome of what a Georgia Tech basketball player should be. I have complete confidence that Deja will be an impact member of our Georgia Tech women's basketball staff and family."

Foster and teammate Alex Montgomery finished their four-year careers with four 20-win seasons and four NCAA Tournament berths, including a then-program-best fifth seed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The duo tallied 91 career wins and a . 689 career winning percentage, both of which were school records for a graduating class. During her senior season, Foster helped Tech to a school-record 24 wins and a 13-game winning streak.
"I am incredibly lucky to be an assistant coach at my alma mater," Foster said. "I am also extremely honored and excited about this opportunity Coach Joseph has given me. I plan to remain a sponge, soaking up as much knowledge as I can with all of the experience that surrounds me."

During her four-year career, Foster played in 121 games and started 73. She converted nearly 45 percent of her field goal attempts and finished with 799 points. Foster added 561 rebounds, 252 assists and 180 steals for the Yellow Jackets.

Foster was a three-time co-captain for the Yellow Jackets and
 excelled in the classroom as well, earning Dean's List honors six times and was named to the 2010 All-ACC Academic Team.


## MICHAEL WHOLEY

Assistant Coach | 2nd Season | Emerson College (Mass.) '04

Michael Wholey, proven in recruiting, scouting and developing the talents of perimeter players, begins his second season at Georgia Tech in 2014-15.

At Tech, Wholey serves as the program's scouting coordinator and is heavily involved with recruiting and the development of the perimeter players.

In his first season on the Flats, the Yellow Jackets recorded a 20win season (20-12) and were named a \#10 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Wholey came to the Flats after five seasons at the University of Memphis, where he was head coach Melissa McFerrin's first hire. During his time with the Tigers, the program recorded three consecutive 20-win seasons and advanced to post season play in each of the last four seasons.
"Michael Wholey is an experienced recruiter in the Southeast," Joseph said. "He has great basketball knowledge and skill. I am excited to have someone with his work ethic and desire to excel join our program. It has been a refreshing experience to be surrounded with so much energy and desire to be the best. I look forward to working with Michael to grow Georgia Tech into a national power."

Wholey's duties at Memphis included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator, as well as working on the development of the perimeter players. Wholey helped develop Brittany Carter, who earned three-straight All-Conference-USA selections and is currently playing professionally in Israel, Ramses Lonlack, the 2012 Conference-USA Player of the Year and a member of the Nigerian national team, as well as Ariel Hearn, a member of the 2013 Conference-USA All-Freshman Team.

During his time with the Tigers, he also played a significant role in landing three-straight top-50 nationally ranked recruiting classes, including the 2012 class that was ranked No. 38 by ESPN Hoopgurlz. In the last five years, two of those players led C-USA in scoring and have received numerous accolades including 2013 CollegeMadness.Com C-USA Player of the Year, 2012 C-USA Player of the Year, 2012 C-USA Defensive Player of the Year, 2010 Newcomer of the Year, three C-USA All-Defensive Team selections, three C-USA FirstTeam selections, two C-USA Second Team selections, two C-USA Third team Selections and two C-USA Freshman Team selections.

Prior to arriving at Memphis, Wholey was an assistant at American University in Washington, D.C., during the 2007-08 season. The Eagles won a school-record 12 straight games and captured the program's first Patriot League title.

Having worked at all levels, Wholey was also the video \& travel coordinator for the WNBA's San Antonio Silver Stars, an assistant coach for Odessa Junior College, and served as an assistant varsity boys basketball coach at Pembroke HS.

Wholey earned his bachelor's degree in visual and media arts from Emerson College (Boston, Mass.) in 2004 where he was a member of the men's basketball team. He is originally from Marshfield, Mass., is the son of Paul and Nancy Wholey and has two siblings, Bryan and Katie.


## M.L. WILLIS

Assistant Coach | 2nd Season | lowa '98

Georgia Tech head women's basketball coach MaChelle Joseph announced the hiring of M.L. Willis as the newest assistant coach for the Yellow Jackets May 2, 2013.

In her first season on the Flats, the Yellow Jackets recorded a 20-win season (20-12) and were named a \#10 seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

Willis came to Georgia Tech after four years at West Virginia and brings 13 years of coaching experience to the Yellow Jacket staff.

During her time with the Mountaineers, Willis helped lead WVU to four NCAA Tournament appearances. West Virginia won at least 20 games in three of her four years, including a programbest 29 victories in 2009-10. In only her second year, Willis and the Mountaineers posted the best start ever for a WVU team as the Mountaineers began the 2010-11 season 19-0 and had the No. 1 ranked scoring defense nationally for five weeks. WVU won three straight games over top-25 opponents for the first time in school history during the 2011-12 season.

Willis drew on her expertise with posts and forwards at West Virginia to help develop Asya Bussie into a 2009-10 All-Big East Freshman Team unanimous selection. Bussie went on to earn first team All-Big East as a junior in 2011-12. Willis also coached All-Big East selections Liz Repella, Sarah Miles and Korrine Campbell while at WVU. In 2012-13, forward Jess Harlee was selected to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team.

Willis arrived in Morgantown after two years as an assistant coach at Norfolk State. During her three previous seasons at Elizabeth City State, Willis coached post player Celeste Trahan, who became the first player in Division II history to score 2,000 points and grab 1,500 rebounds in a career. Willis also held assistant coach positions at the University of Illinois-Chicago, Chicago State and Cheyney University.

A native of Queens, N.Y., Willis played at Christ the King High for three years and spent her senior season at Trinity High in Cleveland, Ohio. Christ the King was the No. 1 nationally ranked prep squad and won the national title in 1993. During her senior season, Willis helped Trinity High gain similar recognition as her team was ranked No. 2 after winning the national title and she was named a Parade All-American.

Willis was recruited to the University of Iowa by Hall of Fame
head coach C. Vivian Stringer where she was a part of the No. 1 ranked recruiting class. The Hawkeyes won the 1995 Big Ten regular season title and consecutive Big Ten Tournament titles in 1995 and 1996.

A four-year letterwinner at lowa, Willis earned bachelor's degrees in media studies and African-American studies in 1998. She played professionally for Color Cap Tybnik of Poland and Tapiola Honka of Finland in 1999, and Brazil's Santa Maria Club in 2000.

In 2011, Willis was inducted into the Ohio Basketball Hall of Fame and Museum. In addition, she was selected to attend the prestigious Villa 7 Consortium in 2013, which brings together university athletic directors and elite assistant basketball coaches in an effort to prepare the next generation of college basketball leaders. In 2014, Willis was inducted in the Christ the King High Hall of Fame.


## CATHERINE GREENE

## Director of Operations

Catherine Greene begins her third season as a member of the Georgia Tech women's basketball staff in 2014-15 and her second as Director of Basketball Operations.

Greene works closely with Joseph in overseeing all aspects of the program's day-to-day operations. Greene oversees the Yellow Jackets' team travel, promotional and fundraising efforts, community service initiatives and community relations. Greene also serves as the director of the MaChelle Joseph Basketball Camps and the liaison for academics and the Total Person Program.

She joined the Tech staff for the 2012-13 season as the associate director of basketball operations after spending the previous two and a half years working full-time in event operations at the University of North Carolina.

During her time at UNC, Greene served as director or co-director of more than 10 NCAA or ACC postseason
championship events. She also worked as the gameday manager for the Tar Heels' men's and women's soccer, field hockey, women's basketball, men's and women's lacrosse and baseball teams.

Greene graduated from North Carolina in 2008 with Bachelor of Arts degrees in sociology and from the School of Journalism and Mass Communication with a public relations concentration. She earned a Masters of Arts in exercise and sport science with a sport administration specialization in 2010.

During her undergraduate career, Greene served as a manager for the Tar Heels' women's basketball team and was the head manager for three years. While she was with UNC, the Tar Heels won four ACC championships and advanced to the 2006 and 2007 Final Fours. As a graduate student, Greene was a graduate student assistant for the women's team for one season before serving as the graduate intern for the Dean E. Smith Center. Greene helped start and run several youth basketball clinics in North Carolina.

Greene was born in Gastonia, N.C., and played high school basketball with former Yellow Jacket Tiffany Blackmon.


## Director of Video Player Personnel

Mike Harkness begins his third season with the Georgia Tech women's basketball program as Director of Video Player Personnel.

Harkness is in his 14th year of working in the video profession and has spent the previous 11 years of his career at the University of Maryland.

Harkness was most recently the director of coaches video at Maryland, a promotion he earned after a year as assistant director of coaches video.

In his latest role with the Terps, Harkness, along with his staff of two assistants and four students, oversaw the video needs for all Maryland sports except football.

He transitioned into working with all Terrapin sports after holding a graduate internship position with the basketball video department. He worked with the women's basketball team that won the 2006 national championship and the 2009 ACC Tournament title.

While a student in College Park, Harkness began his career in the spring of 1999 working in the video department with the Maryland football team.

Senior Woman Administrator

Theresa Wenzel enters her ninth season as the Senior Woman Administrator at Georgia Tech and also holds the title of Associate Director of Athletics. She oversees women's basketball, volleyball, softball, golf, men's and women's tennis, and the men's and women's swimming \& diving teams in her role.

Wenzel is the athletic department non-academic liaison to the Office of Student Affairs. She is also a member of various committees including the Georgia Tech Women's Resource Center Advisory Board, the Title IX Compliance Committee, the GTAA Compliance and Equity Committee and the NCAA Athletic Certification Steering Committee. Wenzel also serves on the ACC Equity Committee, the ACC Women's Basketball Committee, ACC Softball Committee and the ACC Women's Tennis Committee.

In 2011, Wenzel earned the prestigious Administrator of the Year award from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) for her excellence in athletic administration. The WBCA Administrator of the Year Award is awarded annually to an administrator, athletic director, associate or assistant athletic director, or senior woman administrator who has promoted women's basketball in a positive manner through clinics, speaking engagements, books, articles, research and/or special promotions at the local, regional and/or national levels, and who
has served as a professional role-model for student athletes.

Wenzel possesses a wide range of experience in athletic administration and coaching. She joined the Georgia Tech Athletic Association staff in October of 2005 after an eight-year stint at Siena College (N.Y.), where she served as Assistant and then Associate Athletics Director of business operations while also coaching the women's golf team.

While at Siena, Wenzel served one year as the school's intramural director and assistant facilities director before being named Assistant Athletic Director for business operations and head women's golf coach in 1998. In seven seasons as head golf coach, Wenzel led the Saints to five consecutive Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference titles from 2001-2005. She relinquished her coaching duties following the 2005 season when she was promoted to Associate Athletics Director.

Prior to her time at Siena, Wenzel spent three years (1994-97) as an assistant women's basketball coach at Canisus College in Buffalo, N.Y., and she also served an internship with the National Invitational Tournament.

## GEORGATEOH

## MIKE BOBINSKI

Director of Athletics

Mike Bobinski, who has successfully directed athletic departments at Akron and Xavier for a combined 20 years and has worked as a collegiate athletics administrator for 30 years, embarks on his second year as director of athletics at the Georgia Institute of Technology.

Bobinski oversees an athletic department that includes 17 NCAA Division I varsity sports and is rich with athletic tradition and success.

Just the eighth Georgia Tech director of athletics over the past 110 years, Bobinski joins the likes of John Heisman, William Alexander, Bobby Dodd and Homer Rice who have served in the role previously.

Bobinski, whose tenure officially began April 1, 2013, served as chair of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee for the 2012-13 season. That successful role concluded with the 2013 Final Four, which coincidentally was held in Atlanta.

Bobinski came to Georgia Tech after serving 12 years as director of athletics at Cincinnati's Xavier University, where he also served as associate vice president. He was hired as the Musketeers' director of athletics in 1998 and remained in the role until 2004, when he was named associate vice president for development and oversaw all of the university's fundraising efforts, including major gifts, grant services and annual and planned giving. He returned as athletic director in 2006.
"We are very pleased to welcome Mike Bobinski to Georgia Tech as our new director of athletics," Georgia Tech president Dr. G.P. "Bud" Peterson said upon his hiring. "Mike's proven record of success and his diverse background in sports, finance and development, as well as his unwavering commitment to studentathletes, make him the ideal person to lead our athletic program."

At Xavier, Bobinski headed an athletic program that strived to excel in the classroom as well as on the playing fields and courts. In 2012, Xavier ranked 11th nationally in Division I Graduation Success Rates at 97 percent. In June of 2012, the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics named Bobinski the Under Armour Division I Northeast Athletic Director of the Year.

During his tenure, nine of Xavier's teams and numerous individuals competed in NCAA championship competitions. That includes men's basketball, which reached at least the NCAA Tournament

Sweet 16 in four of the last six years. In the same time span, 25 Xavier teams captured Atlantic 10 Conference championships.

In men's bas-ketball, Xavier averaged 25 wins over Bobinski's 12 years, and earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament 10 times. The Musketeers advanced to the Elite Eight in 2004 and 2008. In addition, men's basket-ball extended its streak to 88 straight seniors that graduated. Women's basketball made runs to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2001 and again in 2010 and in 2011 achieved its highest national ranking in program history at No. 4.

In 2009, Bobinski hired Chris Mack as men's basketball head coach. He also hired Thad Matta as head men's basketball coach in 2001 and Sean Miller as Xavier's first associate head coach. Matta is now head coach at Ohio State and Miller has since taken over as head coach at Arizona. Bobinski also hired former women's basketball coach Kevin McGuff, who spent nine years at Xavier and is now head coach at Ohio State. He also oversaw the opening of The Cintas Center and other significant facility projects, including upgrades to soccer and baseball venues and the development of a golf practice facility.

Prior to joining Xavier, Bobinski served as the University of Akron's athletic director from 1994 to 1998. From 1989 to 1994, he was the associate director of athletics at the U.S. Naval Academy. Prior to that, Bobinski served as the associate and assistant business manager at the University of Notre Dame from 1984 to 1989.

As a licensed certified public accountant, he first went into accounting with Deloitte, Haskins and Sell and Arthur Young \& Company from 1979-82. He also worked for the Walt Disney Company in Orlando from 1982-84 before moving into college athletics at UND in 1984.

Bobinski was hired at Georgia Tech following a three-month, nationwide search. A seven-member committee led by Stephen P. Zelnak Jr. advised Peterson and identified candidates. Bobinski took over for Dan Radakovich, who resigned in November (2012).

A native of Yaphank on Long Island, N.Y., Bobinski received his bachelor of business administration from Notre Dame in 1979, graduating magna cum laude, while playing four years for the Fighting Irish baseball team.

Bobinski has two children, Melissa, a 2009 Xavier graduate, and Brian, a 2012 Ohio State graduate.


## DR.G.P "BUD" PETERSON

 Institute PresidentSince assuming the role as Georgia Tech's 11th president in 2009, Dr. G. P. "Bud" Peterson has engaged the Georgia Tech community in developing and implementing a 25 -year strategic plan. He has realigned Tech's administrative units for greater effectiveness, championed efforts to strengthen the Institute's leadership in innovation, expanded strategic partnerships, and worked to maximize Tech's impact in the state, region, nation, and the world.

Launched in conjunction with Tech's strategic plan, "Designing the Future," Campaign Georgia Tech has raised more than $\$ 1.25$ billion towards its goal of $\$ 1.5$ billion. This generosity of Tech's many supporters will help the Institute realize its goals outlined in the strategic plan, add endowed chairs and professorships, scholarships and fellowships, and both renovate existing and build new facilities.

Georgia Tech continues to benefit from the generous philanthropic support and its many partnerships. In the past four years, renovations and new facilities on campus include the McCamish Pavilion, the Ken Byers Tennis Complex, the John and Mary Brock Football Practice Facility, the Zelnak Basketball Practice Facility, the Clough Undergraduate Learning Commons, and the Carbon Neutral Energy Solutions Lab. Now under construction is the Engineered Biosystems Building, which will extend Tech's vision for interdisciplinary research, addressing many of today's grand challenges in biomedical science and human health.

Under Peterson's leadership Georgia Tech is taking a leading role in creating an "Innovation Zone" in Midtown Atlanta that has attracted companies such as Panasonic, Penguin Computing and AT\&T Mobility's Foundry. Technology Square is a high-energy hub, creating an exciting environment for innovation to flourish.

Tech's research strategy focuses on creating transformative opportunities, strengthening collaboration, and maximizing economic and societal impact. Georgia Tech remains among the top 10 in research expenditures among universities without a medical school, with $\$ 689$ million in research expenditures in 2012.

Peterson is a champion of the G. Wayne Clough Georgia Tech Promise program, working to increase corporate and individual support. Tech Promise offers a debt-free Georgia Tech education to academically qualified Georgia residents from low-income families. More than 200 students were enrolled in the program this past year with an average family income of less than $\$ 21,000 /$ year, and almost 600 students have participated to date.

Peterson came to Georgia Tech from the University of Colorado at Boulder, where he served as chancellor. Prior to that, he served as provost at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in New York; on the faculty and in leadership positions at Texas A\&M University for 19 years; and he has worked at both NASA and the National Science Foundation (NSF).

Throughout his career, Peterson has played an active role in helping to establish the national education and research agendas, serving on numerous industry, government and academic task forces and
committees. A distinguished scientist, he was appointed in 2008 by President

George W. Bush to serve as a member of the National Science Board, which oversees the National Science Foundation and advises the President and Congress on national policy related to science and engineering research and education. In 2011, President Barack Obama appointed him to the Advanced Manufacturing Partnership steering committee.

Under his leadership, Georgia Tech was invited to become a member of the Association of American Universities (AAU), the first university to be invited to membership in ten years.

Peterson is a fellow of both the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA), and received the AIAA Distinguished Service Award in 2011. His research has focused on phase change heat transfer in both the cooling of electronic devices and spacecraft thermal control. He is widely published, authoring or co-authoring 15 books or book chapters, 210 refereed journal articles, and more than 160 conference publications. He also holds nine patents with two others pending.

Peterson earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering, a second bachelor's degree in mathematics, and a master's degree in engineering, all from Kansas State University. While an undergraduate at Kansas State, Peterson lettered three years as a tight end/wide receiver for the Wildcats football team. He earned a PhD in mechanical engineering from Texas A\&M University.

President Peterson is a tireless ambassador for Georgia Tech. He and his wife of 39 years, Val, represent Georgia Tech globally, nationally, and locally, speaking to government, business and industry, and community leaders, as well as to civic and community groups, faculty, staff, students, and alumni. He and Val have four adult children, two of which are Tech alumni.

## GEORGATEOH 2013-14 NOTEBOOK

During the 2013-14 season, the Yellow Jackets completed their seventh 20 win season in the past eight years under head coach MaChelle Joseph. The Jackets also received their seventh at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament under Coach Joseph. Tech finished the season at 20-12 and seventh in the ACC with a 9-7 conference record.

Prior to the 2013-14 season, Joseph signed high school All-American and the number one recruit in the country, Kaela Davis. Davis, along with senior Tyaunna Marshall, helped the Jackets average 79.7 points per game in 201314 - the highest scoring average for a team under Coach Joseph. Marshall became the all-time leading scorer in school history and the first Jacket to score 2,000 points. She finished her career with 2,129 points and was named to the All-ACC First Team, ACC All-Defensive Team and the Georgia College Women's Player of the Year by the Atlanta Tipoff Club for the second consecutive year.

Davis was honored on the All-ACC Second Team and ACC All-Freshman Team. Davis was the fourth-straight All-ACC Freshman Team honoree and sixth overall under Coach Joseph.

## MARSHALL NAMED ALL-AMERICA

Georgia Tech women's basketball senior Tyaunna Marshall was named an honorable mention All-American by the Associated Press. Marshall was also named an honorable mention AP All-American in 2013, making her the first Yellow Jacket to garner All-America honors in back-to-back seasons. Marshall is just the second Yellow Jacket to earn recognition from the Associated Press. Kisha Ford was named an honorable mention AP All-American in 1997.

The All-America honor joins a long list of awards for Marshall that includes All-ACC First Team, ACC All-Defensive Team and the Georgia College Women's Player of the Year, awarded by the Atlanta Tipoff Club.

## TECH TIDBITS

- Senior Tyaunna Marshall became Georgia Tech's all-time leading scorer against \#13/11 UNC on Feb. 6, 2014 after scoring 32 against the Tar Heels to break Kisha Ford's record of 1,955 points. Marshall scored 20 points against Virginia to become the first Yellow Jacket and

24th ACC player to reach the 2,000 point mark. Her 2,129 career points which ranks 17th on the ACC's career list.

- Marshall led all active ACC players in career 20 point games with 41 . She had 17 in 2013-14. - Out of the Jackets' 20 wins in 2013-14, 10 games have been won by 20 or more points with its biggest margin of victory being 50 points against Portland State.
- In 16 out of 32 games, the Jackets have scored at least 80 points. Tech is averaging 79.7 ppg. - In 26 out of Tech's 32 games, at least one Jacket has scored 20 points or more. Davis has scored 20+ in 13 games while Marshall has scored at least 20 in 16. Both Marshall and Davis scored more than 20 against UTEP, Clemson, \#6 Maryland, \#13 UNC, Virginia twice and Boston College.
Wallace hit the 20-point mark against Miami, Florida State and LSU and Whiteside scored 21 at Notre Dame and against Boston College -The Jackets were on a 15-game streak of outrebounding their opponents, until Virginia Tech edged the Jackets by one rebound. Tech has won the rebounding battle in 24 out of 32 games this season and average 44.0 rpg . The Jackets are 17-7 when they outrebound their opponent.
- The Yellow Jackets averaged an impressive 92 points per game at home during its nonconference portion of their schedule on their way to a 7-0 record at McCamish.


## GEORGIA TECH IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

 After losing to LSU, 98-78, in the first round, the Yellow Jackets are 5-9 all-time in the NCAA Tournament. The Jackets have made the NCAA Tournament seven out of the last eight seasons under Coach Joseph. Joseph is 5-7 in the NCAA Tournament, going 4-3 in the first round. In three out of its last five appearances, Tech has won its first round game.Under Joseph's direction, the Jackets have been named as high as a \#4 seed (2012) and as low as a \#10 seed $(2008,2014)$.

MARSHALL SELECTED 14TH IN THE WNBA DRAFT
Marshall was selected 14th overall by the New York Liberty in the second round of the 2014 WNBA Draft. Marshall is the eighth Georgia Tech player drafted and the sixth under head coach MaChelle Joseph.

Marshall is the fifth Yellow Jacket drafted in the second round of the WNBA Draft, joining Sonja Mallory (2003-24th overall pick), Kasha Terry (2006-26th overall pick), Chioma Nnamaka (2008- 21st overall pick) and Brigitte Ardossi (2010-21st overall pick). Both Alex Montgomery (2011-10th overall pick) and Sasha Goodlett (2012-11th overall pick) were chosen in the first round. Marshall is the fourth Yellow Jacket to be drafted to the New York Liberty, joining Kisha Ford (1997), Mallory (2003), and Montgomery (2011).

## BY THE NUMBERS

In losses, the Jackets only had 18 attempts from the stripe. - In wins, Marshall averaged 20.9 ppg and Davis averaged 19.7 ppg. Marshall averaged 17.6 ppg and Davis averaged 16.7 ppg in losses.


## GEORGIA TECH'S ALL-TIME LEADING SCORER

Senior Tyaunna Marshall became Georgia Tech's all-time leading scorer against \#13/11 North Carolina on Feb. 6, 2014 after scoring 32 points against the Tar Heels to break Kisha Ford's record of 1,955 points. She hit two free throws with 4.3 seconds left to break the record and secure the Jackets' first win against a ranked opponent since 2012. Marshall is one of just five Yellow Jackets all-time with at least 1,500 career points and 600 career rebounds. With 609 points last season, Marshall is the first Jacket to score 500 points in three-straight seasons. With 20 points against LSU, Marshall broke Tech's single season record of points in a single season of 596 points set by Joyce Pierce (1991-92). She was the first Jacket to score at least 600 points in one season, recording 609 as a senior.

Marshall became the first Yellow Jacket and 24th ACC player to score 2,000 career points after she scored 20 points against Virginia on Feb. 14. What is more remarkable is that Marshall has only made 20 3-pointers in her entire career - meaning that her 878 field goals and 353 made free throw shots contributed to her record-setting numbers. Marshall currently ranks 17th all-time in the ACC record book. Marshall leads all active ACC players in career 20 point games with 41 . She had 17 this season.

## DAVIS SETS ACC AND TECH FRESHMAN RECORD

Against Virginia in the ACC Tournament, Davis broke Karen Lounsbury's (1988-89) freshman scoring record of 539 points with 578 points on the season. Her 578 points also broke the ACC freshmen single season record for points scored. Davis topped Wake Forest's Tracy Conner's 576 points that were
scored in 1992-93. She is just the third freshman to score 500 points in their first season on the Flats.

## ALL-ACC

Georgia Tech senior Tyaunna Marshall was selected to the All-ACC First Team and freshman Kaela Davis was selected to both the All-ACC Second Team and All-Freshman Team by the ACC's Blue Ribbon Panel, which consists of media and school representatives, and the ACC's head coaches. Marshall was also named to the ACC All-Defensive Team by the league's head coaches.

Marshall is the first Yellow Jacket to be named to the All-ACC First Team twice in her career. The $5^{\prime} 9^{\prime \prime}$ guard was honored as a junior on the All-ACC First Team and was the first Jacket to be named to the All-ACC First Team since Sonja Mallory was selected to the team in 2003. Marshall is just the fourth Jacket to earn All-ACC First Team accolades. This is also Marshall's second consecutive year being named to the All-Defensive Team. She is the fifth Yellow Jacket to be named to the All-ACC Defensive Team. Marshall joins Jacqua Williams $(2008,2009)$ as the only Jacket to garner All-ACC Defensive Team honors two seasons in a row.

After a stellar freshman season, Davis was named to both the All-ACC Second Team and All-Freshman Team. Davis led all ACC rookies with her 18.6 ppg and led the Jackets with 2.7 made 3-pointers a game. In her freshman season, Davis recorded 14 20 -point games and led the team in scoring in 15 games. Davis was named the Rookie of the Week four times this season.

## REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK

Marshall cemented her name in the Tech record book in yet another category, this time for scoring the most points in a single season with 609. Marshall broke the previous record of 596 points set by Joyce Pierce in 1991-92 after scoring 20 points against LSU in the NCAA Tournament. Davis was also close to the record, for her 594 points has her third on Tech's individual season points list. Also, Davis' 85 made 3-pointers this season ranks second on Tech's individual season record list for 3-pointers made.

Tech's 2,549 points scored this season ranks second overall in Tech's single season records.

\section*{National Women's Invitation Tournament}

In the first postseason appearance in school history, Georgia Tech's women's basketball team captured the 1992 National Women's Invitational Tournament in Amarillo, Texas. En route to the title, the Jackets defeated Wisconsin-Green Bay, 78-77, in the first round, Nebraska, 73-68, in the semifinals, and Hawaii, 9072, in the championship game. The 1992 NWIT not only marked Tech's first postseason appearance, but it also marked the first NWIT title for an ACC school. In 1998, the NWIT switched names to the WNIT.
