This is a narrative of the use of supplemental funds awarded under the above grant to improve and expand the cooperative education program at Georgia Tech. This program is in compliance with the Title VIII, HEA, Cooperative Education Program Regulations.

The Cooperative Plan has been available as an optional method of education at the Georgia Institute of Technology (at first, the Georgia School of Technology) since 1912. Although total enrollment at Georgia Tech has been held at its present level for several years, the cooperative program enrollment has continued to grow as a percentage of the undergraduate enrollment. At present, over 24% of all undergraduate students are enrolled under the cooperative program, and 31% of the engineering students are co-ops. Because of the restriction of total enrollment, no dramatic growth in the co-op group is anticipated in the immediate future. However, there is much room for improvement in job development and in student communications, and the supplemental funds received this year have been used for this purpose. The following page summarizes the activity in this area that was made possible by these funds.
