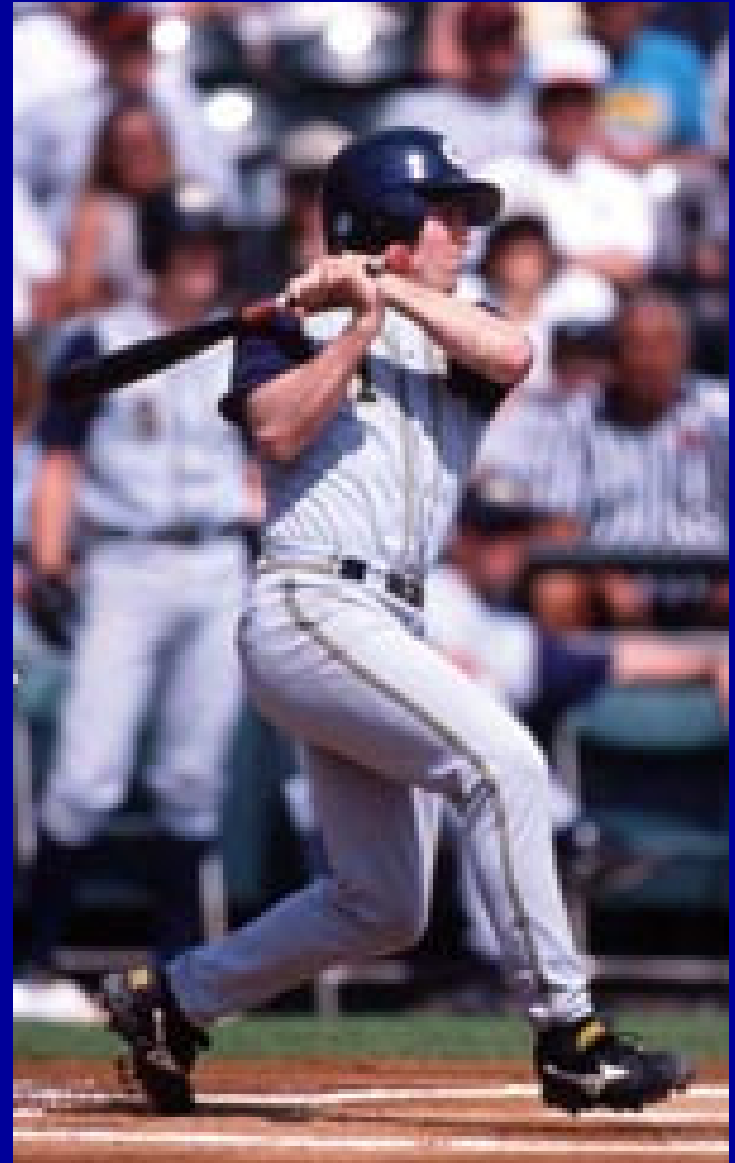

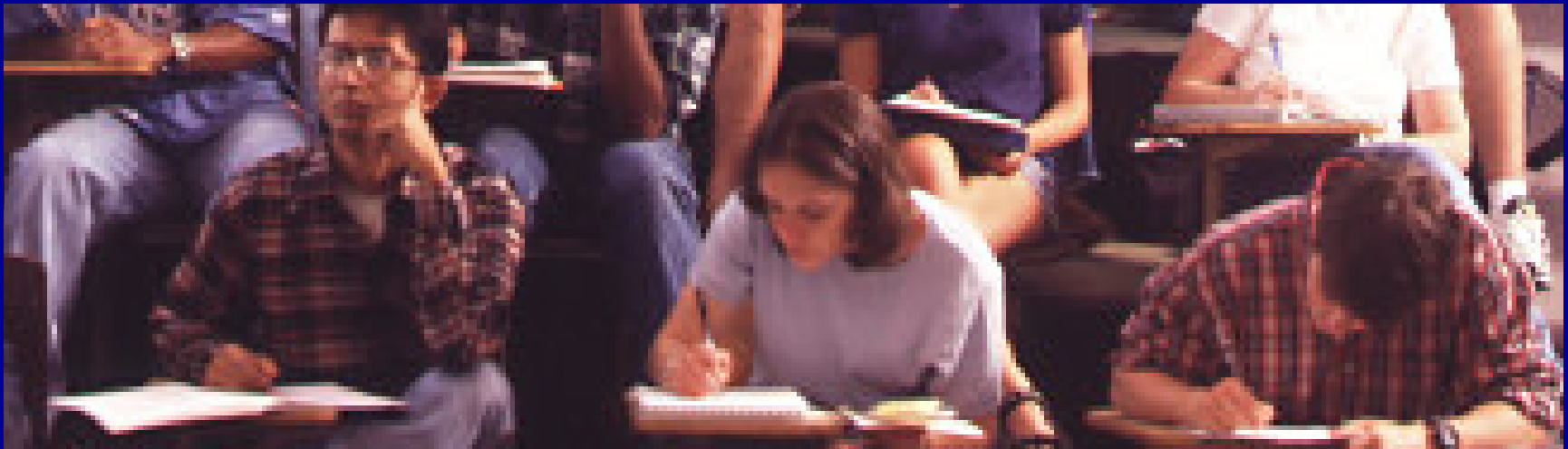

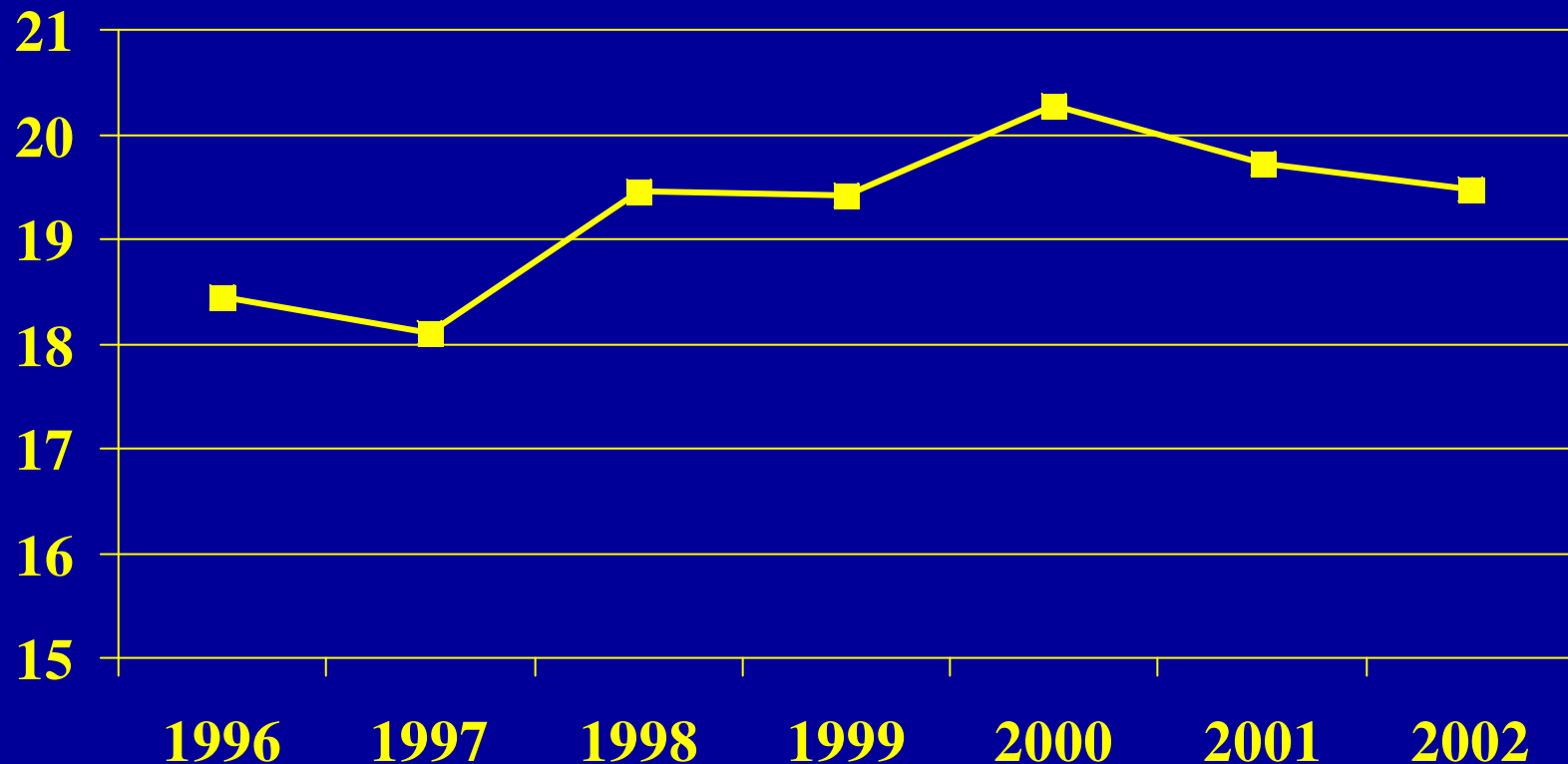


Students

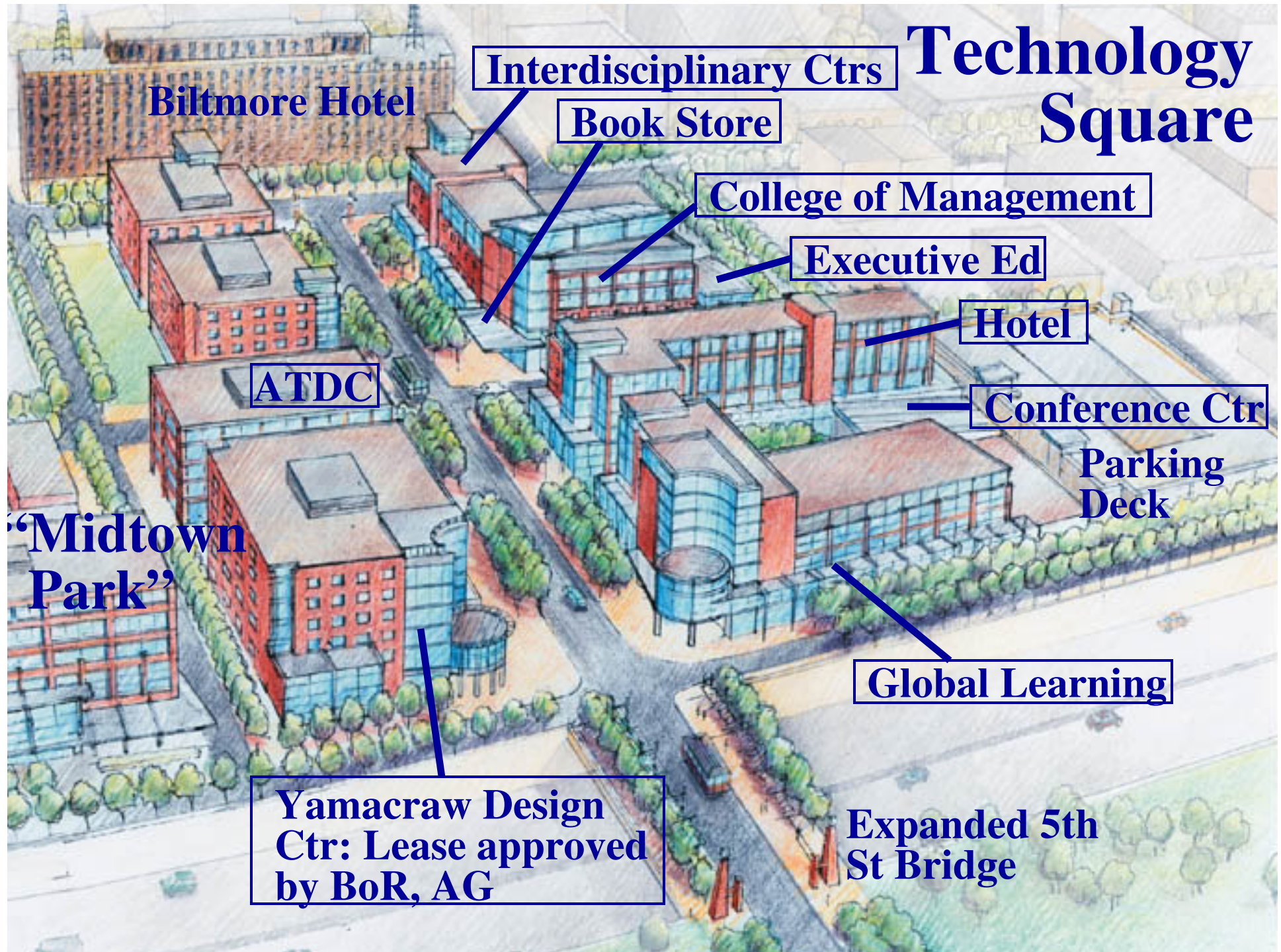
