I think that calls for a round of applause. Among other things, that will create the Class of 1964 Need-Based Scholarship and also the Class of 1964 Ramblin' Wreck Endowment. We continue to attract the best and the brightest, and thanks to the Class of 1964, we'll be able to take in future innovators and leaders who might not otherwise been able to afford to come to Georgia Tech. Their Ramblin' Wreck Endowment also ensures that our beloved campus icon will be maintained and cared for so that it can be enjoyed by future generations of Yellow Jackets.

- In the past 50 plus years you have seen many things change in your own lives and at Georgia Tech. Our Atlanta campus is now over 400 acres, and we have more than 23,000 students worldwide.
- We have an outstanding freshman class of 2,800, from 26,000 applicants. The average SAT of incoming freshmen is 1485. The class is 39% women, an all-time high. By contrast, in 1964 Tech had 85 women, about 1 percent of the student body.
- Average starting salaries of Tech graduates range from \$63,000 to \$65,000.
