What are the team's goals for the upcoming indoor/ outdoor seasons?

We start every new season with the goal of winning the conference championship. You have to have the right people in place and a lot of good things have to happen in order to reach that goal, but that's what we plan for. We also strive hard to consistently be in the top third of the conference year-in and year-out. On a national level, we set our sights on consistently finishing in the top-25 at the NCAA Championships.

Where does Tech stack up against the other competition in the ACC?

The competition in the ACC this year is tight as usual. Every team has that area where they expect to score significant points, but the team that wins will be the one that finds a way to get point production in all areas. So many programs have elevated their competitive ability, but there are only a couple of schools that have the overall team strength that it takes to win the championship. We'll field our youngest team that I can remember in a very long time and we know that we need some areas to really come through for us. That motivates us at every practice and at every meet.

You have three returning all-American's (Shantia Moss, Fatmata Fofanah, Kimery Hern), what do you expect from them this year?

We expect more of the same! All three of them had great seasons last year and have really come into their own. Obviously they are very talented young women, but they also combine their given talents with tremendous determination and a very strong work ethic. We expect them to continue to set that example for our team.

We also have another group of very talented individuals who excelled last season. Jacqua Williams, who joins us for the outdoor season after playing for the basketball program through the winter, had an outstanding year, earning several accolades while qualifying for the NCAA national meet. Jacqua also anchors our 4x100m relay team which has had great success in recent years. Elena Linn earned all-ACC honors with her runner-up finish and qualified for the NCAA East Regional in the 3000m Steeplechase and Jenny Sims also qualified for the NCAA East Regional in the 1500m with an outstanding effort at our home meet last May. Alana Clooten, who redshirted last outdoor season, has some excellent personal bests in the hammer and discus throws.

Who are the freshmen that are going to make an impact on the season?

We have a very good and wide-ranging group of freshmen who can certainly make an impact this year. Most notable are Leslie Njoku in the 400m Hurdles and Jenae Anderson in the sprint events. Joanna Wright and Erica Penk in the pole vault should also be able to be competitive right away. Megan Manning should have a great opportunity in the throwing events. Also, Amanda Montgomery in the 800m, Kayla McKeirnan in the long sprints, and Taylor Davidson in the short sprints will all have a great chance to have an impact as freshmen. Overall, it's a talented group who cover a large range of events and we're excited about how they will develop.

What are your thoughts about hosting two meets, as well as the ACC Outdoor Championships this year?

We're very excited about the opportunity to host this year's ACC Outdoor Championships in April. With twelve schools in the conference now it will be quite a while before we get to host again. Our facility underwent some improvements, most notably the resurfacing of the track, and we're hopeful to be able to bring in some more seating. Many years ago (1987) I was fortunate enough to compete in the ACC Championships here at home, so I know very well how special it is to compete in front of so many family and friends.

Our two other meets, the Yellow Jacket Invitational and the Georgia Tech Invitational, are both outstanding meets that we always look forward to hosting.

How do you continue to keep the program at a consistent competitive level?

Staying at a consistent competitive level comes down to two things, recruiting and coaching. Those two things may sound simple but they are hard work, year-round and dynamic activities.

We work hard to find talented kids who fit our philosophy in regards to having versatility, but who also fit Georgia Tech. We look at academic factors and character factors. We look at how they have developed over the course of their careers. The other side to the equation is that you have to do the very best in developing the student-athletes in your program, which covers many facets from strength & conditioning, to technical development, nutrition and recovery, etc. We want to work with every student-athlete to develop their given talent to the fullest, and to put them in the best opportunities to be successful.

As coaches, we also have to keep pushing ourselves to get better, to learn more, and to never rest on past successes.

In short, we are always looking to add talented student-athletes to our program and we are always looking for ways that we can do things better.

HEAD COACH ALAN DROSKY

17th Season Georgia Tech (1987)

Alan Drosky is entering his 13th season as the head coach of the Georgia Tech women's track and field program. He also mentors the distance runners for the Yellow Jackets' men's track team.

Additionally, Drosky recently completed his 17th year as the head coach of both the men's and women's cross country teams at Georgia Tech.

Drosky, a two-time All-American and five-time track All-Atlantic Coast Conference performer, has been head women's coach since the 1995-96 season. He has been a part of the Yellow Jacket coaching staff since 1987, when he took a graduate assistant position while working towards a master's degree in management. After completing his graduate studies in 1989, Drosky became a full-time assistant for the 1990 season and took over the helm of the cross country program in '91.

Prior to earning a Bachelor of Science degree in industrial management in '87, Drosky was one of the most decorated middle distance performers in Tech history. He competed for the Yellow Jackets from 1985-87, serving as team captain three times. He holds the Tech school record in both the 1000 (2:22.78) and 1500 (3:43.37) meter indoor events, and is a member of Tech's outdoor record-holding 4x1600-meter relay (16:32.98).

Drosky earned All-America honors twice at the NCAA Championships, finishing sixth in the indoor mile in 1986 and 12th in the outdoor 1500 meters in 1987. He was also the 1987 ACC champion in the indoor mile.

Following his distinguished career, Drosky was inducted into the Georgia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996.

Since taking the reins of the women's program, Drosky has guided the Yellow Jackets to seven top-three finishes in the last eight years at the ACC Indoor Championships, including the program's first ACC title at the 2002 indoor ACC meet. It was just the second ACC title by any women's program at Georgia Tech and snapped nine consecutive indoor titles by North Carolina. Drosky was named Indoor ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in his career (1999).

The Jackets have been a mainstay atop the ACC standings, posting a combined nine topthree finishes at the indoor and outdoor ACC meets since 2001. Tech scored a program-best 146 points at the outdoor meet in 2004.

Nationally, Drosky led the Yellow Jackets to their highest NCAA outdoor finish at the 2004 NCAA Outdoor Championships, finishing in a tie for 15th place in Austin, Texas. Tech posted a second top-25 finish at the NCAA Indoor Championships, finishing in a tie for 21st place in Fayetteville, Ark. The Yellow Jackets posted a pair of top-25 finishes in `07, finishing 14th at the indoor meet and posting a 19th-place finish at the outdoor meet.

Drosky has led Tech to a total of 10 top-30 finishes, including two top-15 finishes at the NCAA Championships.

Chaunte Howard became the first Tech athlete to win three consecutive national titles, claiming the NCAA high jump crown at the indoor and outdoor NCAA Championships in `04, and winning the crown again at the 2005 NCAA Indoor Championships.

Howard became the first women's athlete from Tech to qualify for the Summer Olympic Games, finishing second at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials in the high jump to stamp her ticket to Athens, Greece. On a rare off day, Howard finished in a tie for 28th place at the XXVIII Olympiad. She turned professional in the summer of 2005, after her junior season, and went on to win a Silver medal in the high jump at the 2005 IAAF World Championships, in Helsinki, Finland.

In addition to his mentoring of the women's program, Drosky has also coached several of the nation's top men's distance performers. Headlining that list is David Krummenacker, who won the 1997 and `98 NCAA indoor 800-meter national titles, still holds four different school records and was named the 1997 and `98 ACC Indoor and Outdoor Championship MVP while at Tech. Under Drosky, Krummenacker won 12 individual ACC titles and captured the U.S. 800meter national title in 2001. He has gone on to win two more U.S. national titles in the 800m (2002-03) and captured a World indoor 800m title in 2003. Krummenacker ranks as the fastest American 800-1500-meter doubler of all-time and set the American record in the indoor 1000 meters in 2002.

Recent graduate Brendon Mahoney ranks among Drosky's finest proteges. He was a three-time All-American and finished seventh in the mile at the 2002 NCAA Indoor Championships. He also finished eighth in the 800m at the 2002 U.S. National Outdoor Championships, a race won by Krummenacker. In 2004, Mahoney won ACC titles in the indoor 800 and mile, and the outdoor 800- and 1500-meter races en route to being named ACC Performer of the Year for both the indoor and outdoor seasons. He went on to earn All-America honors in the 1500m at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Drosky's top women's competitors include Tech assistant coach Becky Megesi and former standout Renee Metivier. Megesi garnered All-America honors with an eighth-place finish in the 1500 meters in 1999 and was a member of the seventh-place distance medley team in 2000. She won the ACC outdoor 1500-meter title in both 1998 and `99 and qualified for the NCAA Championship meet in both the 800- and 1500-meters in 1999, as well as the 800m in 2000.

Metivier had an outstanding 2002, becoming the first Jacket to earn All-America honors in cross country, indoor and outdoor track. During the indoor season, she earned that status in the 3000- and 5000-meters. She also claimed All-America accolades with an eighth-place finish in the 5000m at the outdoor NCAA meet. Metivier now holds four school records.

Beth Mallory also earned All-America honors under Drosky, placing sixth in the mile at the 1996 NCAA Indoor Championships.

In his career, Drosky has coached his athletes to three national titles as Krummenacker won two in the 800m and Conrad Nichols won one in the 4x400m relay. His athletes have earned 65 NCAA All-American honors, 64 ACC championships and 142 All-ACC accolades.

In cross country, Drosky has also led the team to success in one of the nation's top cross country conferences. He has guided the women's team to a pair of NCAA Championship appearances (2000, `01), with a top finish of 26th in '01. That same season, he coached the women's team to their first-ever NCAA South Region crown, and was named South Region Coach of the Year. The Jackets' men's team also enjoyed a program-best finish of fourth at the 2001 regional championships. His top ACC finishes came in 1994 with both teams finishing third at the conference championships in Atlanta.


Drosky has mentored three cross country All-Americans and seven NCAA individual qualifiers. Additionally, he has guided Tech runners to 15 All-ACC and 34 all-region performances.

Metivier enjoyed the top season in Tech cross country history in 2001, finishing second at the NCAA Championships, winning the NCAA South Regional title and placing second at the ACC Championships.

Mallory earned All-America honors in 1995, placing 25th, and also earned All-ACC honors three times. Additionally, Megesi was an individual qualifier in '98.

On the men's side, Kevin Graham is the lone All-American in Tech history, finishing 32nd in '94. Senior Kyle Rabbitt earned All-ACC honors in cross country at the 2004 ACC Championships, finishing 14th. Rabbitt was the third Tech athlete to gualify for the NCAA Championships in 2003.

A native of Riverdale, Ga., and a former Georgia state champion in the mile at Riverdale High School, Drosky is married to the former Kim Bohanon, who ran cross country at Georgia State. The couple has two daughters: Hayley, 15, and Hannah, 12.





Assistant Coaches

ALLEN BRADD

Throws Coach 5th Season North Carolina (1999)

Allen Bradd enters his fifth season as assistant men's and women's track and field coach at Georgia Tech. Bradd specializes in the throwing events, along with pole vault and multi events. In four seasons as a Yellow Jacket coach. Bradd has tutored three ACC champions. 19 NCAA



Region qualifiers, Ten All-ACC honorees, one NCAA All-American, led his athletes to seven school records and taken four athletes to the NCAA Championships, including three during the 2007 outdoor season.

The Yellow Jacket throws program concluded 2007 as the most successful in GT history and has emerged into a national power. On the women's side, sophomore Kimery Hern earned All-American honors in the hammer throw with a school-record mark of 196' 7" inches to place ninth at the NCAA Championships. She also finished second in the hammer at the ACC's with a mark of 193' 5". Hern represented Tech at the 2007 NCAA East Region Meet in both the hammer and discus and has a personal best in the discus of 158' 7" inches. Freshman Samantha Musil qualified for the NCAA National Championships meet in the discus with a throw of 165' 8" inches at the NCAA East Regional meet. She threw a personal best of 167' 5" inches in the qualifying rounds at the NCAA Championships and went on to finish eleventh in the finals. Sophomore Alana Clooten, who red-shirted during the 2007 outdoor season, established a personal best of 194' 2" in the hammer throw at the Auburn Invitational. During the indoor season Clooten recorded a personal best of 60' 9.5" in the weight throw and finished fourth at the ACC Indoor Championships.

On the men's side in 2007, red-shirt freshman Steve Marcelle finished the regular season with the tenth furthest shot put throw in the nation with a throw of 62' 2.5" at the Georgia Tech Invitational. He earned a second place finish at the ACC Championships in the shot put with a throw of 61' 11.75". At the 2007 NCAA East Regional Marcelle represented Tech in both the shot put and discus where he earned All-Region and an NCAA Championships automatic bid in the Discus with a season best of 180' 4". Marcelle went on to finish twentieth at the NCAA Championships with a discus throw of 178' 4". Also leading the way for the Jackets was sophomore Andy Powlen who had an NCAA Championships provisional qualifying mark in the shot put of 58' 3.25" inches and had a discus best of 162' 2".

In 2006, Hern qualified for the NCAA East Region Championships in the discus as well as placing third in the hammer and fourth in the discus, with a personal best mark of 158' 7" at the USATF Junior National Championships. Freshman Alana Clooten finished fourth at the USATF Junior National Championships in the hammer and fellow freshman April Philips posted a NCAA East Regional Championships and USATF Junior National Championships qualifying mark of 47' 2.5" in the shot put.

In 2005 Dore Madere broke two outdoor records in the discus and hammer, along with qualifying for the NCAA National Championships in the discus. Madere threw a personal best of 170' 9"at the Regional Championships to automatically qualify her for the NCAA Championships. She finished 19th at the outdoor NCAA Championship meet.

In 2006, walk-on Eric Massey broke the school record in the men's weight throw with a mark of 62' 2.5". Massey also qualified for the NCAA East Regional Championships with a hammer throw of 201'11". Powlen posted a shot put mark of 57' 11.75" at the ACC Indoor Championships to finish fourth and went on to qualify for the NCAA East Regional Championships where he finished eighth with a mark of 57' 1.5". Nico Shaner, in just his second year of javelin throwing, posted an NCAA Regional qualifying and All-ACC Championships mark by finishing third with a personal-best of 216' 4".

In 2005 Bradd guided Zeb Sion to an indoor school record in the shot put and led Greg McCormick to a new record score of 4,869 points in the heptathlon at the Indoor ACC Championships.

In Bradd's inaugural season with the Yellow Jackets he tutored Sion and Marcus Canty to their first ACC Championship titles in the shot put and javelin, respectively. Canty finished the season with the 23rd best javelin mark in the nation at 227'11".

Prior to coming to Tech, Bradd coached at Syracuse University. He led four athletes to NCAA Championship Provisional qualifying marks in the discus, shot put and weight throw. He had a men's shot putter capture the Big East Conference title and led a freshman women's discus thrower to the 22nd best mark in the nation with a personal best of 172' 4". She went on to qualify for the World Junior Championships in the discus.

Before coaching at Syracuse, Bradd was an assistant men's and women's track and field coach at Murray State University for one season. While at Murray State, he tutored three All-OVC honors in the shot put and discus and a men's pole vaulter who finished runner-up at the Ohio Valley Conference Championships meet in back-to-back seasons.

Bradd has also had excellent success coaching at the post-collegiate level. During the 2005 season he coached Lavern Eve to a 10th place finish in the women's javelin at the World Championships in Helsinki, Finland and a fourth-place finish at the IAAF World Athletics Final in Monaco where she threw a season best of 203'3". He has also guided an athlete who qualified for the 2001 U.S. National Championships in the women's hammer and another to the 2000 Olympic Trials in the women's discus, finishing in 14th place.

Bradd attended the University of North Carolina where he was a two-time All-American in the shot put. He was a five-time individual ACC champion in the shot put and two-time ACC champion in the hammer throw. Bradd was elected team captain in the 1998-99 season and was a member of the UNC Student-Athlete Council board. After graduation, Bradd competed for the Mizuno Klub Kiehas during the 1999-2000 track and field seasons. In 1999, he finished 12th in the shot put at the USATF Outdoor National Championships in Eugene, Ore.

A native of Downs, III, Bradd graduated from North Carolina with a Bachelor's degree in sports exercise and science in 1999. He is married to the former Angie Joy and the couple has a three-year old son, Logan.



ADRIANE LAPSLEY

Sprints/Hurdles Coach 1st Season Georgia Tech (2006)

Adriane Lapsley, a former Georgia Tech track & field all-American, was named assistant women's track & field coach in June of 2007. The former standout oversees the Yellow Jacket sprints and intermediate hurdles, coordinates training of the combined events, handles all aspects of corruiting of these orders and unders administration function



recruiting for those events and various administrative functions.

During her time on the Flats, Lapsley was one of the track & field programs most versatile and accomplished performers, competing in the sprints and hurdles, both the long and triple jump, as well as on many relays.

A 2006 graduate of Georgia Tech, she earned all-America honors three times, once in the 60m indoors and twice in the 4x100m relay. She was an ACC Champion six times, twice each in the 60m, 100m, and 4x100m relay; and earned all-ACC honors a total of nine times. Currently she holds school records in the 55m indoors, as well as the 4x100m, 4x200m, and Shuttle Hurdle relays. She qualified six times for the NCAA championships in her career at Tech. In addition, she served as the women's track & field representative for the GTAA Student-Athlete Advisory Board.

Assistant Coaches

BECKY MEGESI

Distance Coach 7th Season Georgia Tech (2001)

One of the top middle distance runners in Tech history, Becky Megesi enters her seventh year as an assistant for the Jackets cross country and track teams. She primarily works with the distance runners as well as the cross country teams for both men and women. Additionally,

she handles many administrative functions as well as being in charge of recruiting the women's distance events.

As an athlete, Megesi garnered All-American honors in the 1500 meters, finishing eighth at the 1999 NCAA Outdoor Championships in Boise, Idaho. She again earned All-American honors in 2000, anchoring Tech's Distance Medley Relay to a seventh-place finish at the NCAA Indoor Championships in Fayetteville, Ark. Megesi also qualified for the Outdoor NCAA meets in 1999 and 2000 in the 800. In 1998, she became the third Tech individual qualifier for the NCAA Cross Country Championship in Lawrence, Kan. In 2000, Megesi was a qualifier for the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 800 meters. She was a five time NCAA qualifier in her career at Tech.

Megesi won ACC Championships in the 1500m in 1998 and `99, earning All-ACC honors six times during her career. She currently holds school records in the outdoor 800m (2:04.63), the indoor DMR (11:21.48), and the outdoor 4x800m relay (8:56.94).

She earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Management in 2001.

Nat Page is in his 12th year as an assistant coach for the Georgia Tech track and field program. Page is responsible for coaching field events, including high jump, long jump and triple jump, as well as the men's and women's sprint hurdle events.

Since joining the Tech staff in 1997, Page has mentored Tech student-athletes to 32 ACC titles, 32 All-America performances and three national titles. Page was named Mondo Women's Jumps/Multi Events Coach of the Year in 2004.

His latest prodigy, Chaunte Howard captured three consecutive national titles in the women's high jump at the 2004 indoor and outdoor NCAA Championships, and '05 indoor NCAA Championships. She became the first women's athlete to qualify for the Summer Olympics, finishing second at the '04 U.S. Olympic Trials, earning a spot on the U.S. team.

In Athens, Greece, Howard finished in a tie for 28th place on a rare off day. She ended her career at Tech as a six-time ACC champion, six-time All-American, three-time NCAA champion and three-time ACC Most Valuable Performer. Howard signed a professional contract with NIKE, forgoing her senior season, but continues to train under Page and attend classes at Tech. She went on to earn a Silver medal at the 10th IAAF World Championships, in Helsinki, Finald, with a lifetime-best mark of 6'6.75" in the high jump. Howard currently ranks sixth in the world and is the top American in the high jump.

Andria King, a former assistant coach at Tech, was another highlight under coach Page's tutelage. Page coached King to four NCAA national runner-up finishes in the 60- and 100-meter hurdles in 1998 and '99. She formerly held the American collegiate record in the 60m hurdles

with a time of 8.00 in 1999. King was a five-time All-American and three-time ACC MVP.

Other Yellow Jacket All-Americans under Page are Eric Bowers (indoor long jump, 1997), Lynn Houston (indoor high jump, 1999), Malcolm Leason (outdoor triple jump, 2000), Shantrell Moss (4x100m, 2005) Montrell Person (110m HH, 2004/60m HH, 2005), Clayton Porter (indoor long jump, 2000), Dana Rogers (4x100m, 2004, '05/60m HH, '05), Amandi Rhett (4x100m, 100m, 200m, 2005), Brandy Depland (triple jump 2005, `06), Shantia Moss (60m HH, 100m HH, `06/ 60m HH, '07), Andriane Lapsley (60m, 100m, 4x100, `06), Fatmata Fofanah (100m HH, '07) and Jerome Miller (high jump, `06).

On the conference level, he has guided six men to seven conference titles: Bowers (indoor long jump, 1997), Leason (outdoor triple jump, 2000), David Riley (indoor triple jump, 1997), Person (60m HH, 110m HH, 2004-05), James Lemons (indoor and outdoor triple jump, 2007) and Jerome Miller (indoor high jump, 2007).

On the women's side, Page has coached 25 conference championship performances, in addition to King's three hurdle and sprints titles. Lynn Houston won both indoor and outdoor high jump titles in 1997. Mishanta Reyes won the indoor long jump crown in 2001, while Shanta Smith won the indoor triple jump and Jennifer Ledbetter claimed the outdoor high jump title in '02. Howard won a total of six high jump titles in three seasons. The women's 4x100m relay team finished first at the 2005 ACC Outdoor Championships, while Dana Rogers won the indoor 60m hurdles in '05. Lapsley claimed the indoor 60-meter dash and the 90-meter dash at the '05 ACC Championship meets. In 2006, Lapsley garnered first-place finishes in the 60m, 100m and 200m and Shantia Moss won the 100m HH. The 4x100m relay also finished first at the 2006 ACC Outdoor Championships. In 2007 Shantia Moss won the indoor championship in the 60m hurdles and went on the win the national championship in the same event.

In addition to his work at Tech, Page founded Nat's Athletic Training and Career Experiences in September 1993. He has coached eight World Championship team members and a trio of Olympians: Natasha Gibson, Howard and Tisha Waller, who is now the American indoor record holder in the high jump. Page has also worked with Wenda Vereen, who was a member of the U.S. 4x100m team, which won a Silver medal and set an American record at the 1993 World Championships. Howard captured a Silver medal at the 2005 IAAF World Championships in Helsinki, Finald, with a lifetime-best leap of 6'6.75" in the high jump.

Waller joined Howard on the 2004 U.S. Olympic Team in the high jump after capturing her second U.S. title at the U.S. Olympic Trials in Sacramento, Calif.

A native of Evanston, Ill., Page was a NCAA Champion high jumper at the University of Missouri in 1979. He was ranked in the top 10 in the world from 1979-81 and earned a spot on the United States' 1980 Olympic team after finishing second at the U.S. Olympic Trials.

Additionally, Page also competed at a world-class level in the both the high and intermediate hurdles from 1984-92. From 1990-92, he was ranked in the top 10 in the world in the 400 intermediate hurdles. A member of the United States' 1992 World Cup team, Page was a finalist at the U.S. Track and Field Championships every year from 1985-91.

He was inducted into the University of Missouri Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999, where he was a five-time All-American and a four-time Big 8 high jump champion. He was named outdoor MVP of the Big 8 Championship in 1978.

From 1988-91, Page served as assistant coach at California State Polytechnic University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education.

Page resides in Atlanta with his stepchildren, Tyler and Ryan.

Dr. WAYNE CLOUGH President

Georgia Tech (1965)

The chief engineer of Georgia Tech's effort to leverage the opportunities inherent in economic, cultural, social, and technological transitions, Dr. G. Wayne Clough is the Institute's tenth president and the first alumnus to serve as president.

His leadership continues to make undergraduate education more dynamic. After implementing a required computer initiative for all students, he oversaw the revision

of the curriculum to include Web-based enhancements. The next step was a broad initiative to engage students more fully with faculty in the classroom and research lab, expand study abroad programs, and create more student leadership opportunities. The positive impact is reflected in higher quality students and higher retention rates.

Sponsored research has also increased every year since Clough became president. In the past seven years, research expenditures have increased significantly, doubling over the past decade to \$425 million in the past year, as Tech moves into exciting interdisciplinary fields like bioengineering, sustainable technology, and nanoscience.

Clough's skills as a civil engineer are evident as the campus is reshaped to meet the needs of Tech's world-class programs and students. He has overseen an ambitious \$1 billion building program, with the construction of more than a dozen academic and research buildings.

His emphasis on creating well-rounded college graduates was recently recognized by bestselling author Thomas Friedman. In the second edition of his 2005 book The World Is Flat,

Friedman praises Clough's efforts as "the right stuff," holding up Clough's balance of leftbrain research activities with right-brain creative endeavors as a model for other college educators.

Outside of the Tech campus, Clough is also recognized as a leader. He gives Georgia Tech a voice in Washington, D.C., as the only person to serve on both the National Science Board and the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (PCAST). He is also vice chairman of the U.S. Council on Competitiveness and chaired the National Academy of Engineering's Engineer of 2020 initiative. Since September of 2001, he has represented the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) on the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I Board of Directors.

In January 2006, Clough was asked to lend his expertise to the city of New Orleans, which was devastated by Hurricane Katrina in 2005. Named chief of the National Academies/National Research Council Committee (NAE/NRC) on New Orleans Regional Hurricane Protection Projects, Clough led the first meeting of the sixteen-member NAE/NRC, reviewing the designs and plans for rebuilding the flood protection systems around New Orleans and overseeing studies into why levee failures occurred in the city. Under Clough's leadership, Georgia Tech also helped evacuees and students displaced by the hurricane, allowing campus buildings to be used as shelter spaces, among other emergency-response initiatives.

A native of Douglas, Georgia, Clough received his bachelor's and master's degrees in civil engineering from Georgia Tech in 1963 and 1965. He earned a Ph.D. in civil engineering from the University of California, Berkeley in 1969.

Clough was provost and vice president for academic affairs at the University of Washington in Seattle when he answered the call to return to his alma mater as president in September of 1994. Prior to that, he had spent a decade at Virginia Tech as head of the Department of Civil Engineering, then as dean of the College of Engineering. He also served on the faculties of Duke and Stanford universities.

A specialist in geotechnical and earthquake engineering, he is the author of more than 120 papers and reports, six book chapters, and several widely used geotechnical computer codes. He is presently a consultant to the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit System for ongoing major seismic retrofitting. His other interests include technology and higher education policy, economic development, diversity in higher education, and technology in a global setting.

Closer to home, he serves on the Board of Advisors for Noro-Moseley Partners, the Southeast's largest venture capital fund, and on the Board of Directors of Total System Services of Columbus, Georgia. He is a member of the executive committees for the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce and a trustee of the Georgia Research Alliance. Georgia Trend magazine has regularly included Clough on its list of the 100 most influential Georgians.

Among his many national awards for teaching and research, Clough holds eight from the American Society of Civil Engineers and is one of a select few to have twice been awarded the Norman Medal, civil engineering's oldest honor. In 2001, he received the National Engineering Award from the American Association of Engineering Societies, and he recently received the American Society of Civil Engineers' 2004 Outstanding Projects and Leaders (OPAL) lifetime award for his contributions to education. He has been a member of the National Academy of Engineering for fifteen years.

Wayne and Anne Robinson Clough have been married for more than thirty years and have two grown children.



DAN RADAKOVICH

Director of Athletics IU-Pennsylvania (1980)

Now in his second year as Georgia Tech's Director of Athletics, Dan Radakovich has brought a new vision for excellence to the Yellow Jackets' storied athletics tradition.

His first year at Tech saw many successes by the Yellow Jackets' teams. Tech's women's tennis team captured the Institute's first-ever NCAA championship in 2007 and its third straight Atlantic Coast Conference title. The football

team won the ACC Coastal Division and went to its 10th straight bowl game, the men's basketball team earned its third NCAA Tournament bid in the last four years, the women's basketball team posted its finest season ever with 21 wins and a berth in the NCAA Tournament, and the golf team won a share of the ACC title for the second straight year.

Outside the competition venues, Radakovich directed an overhaul of the annual giving and donation structure for Tech athletics, anchored by the new TECH Fund, which establishes minimum giving levels tied to season tickets in various seating areas of Bobby Dodd Stadium and Alexander Memorial Coliseum. Several facility upgrades have been completed, including the transformation of Tech's former football locker room on the ground floor of the Edge Athletic Center into a new Technology Center, which benefits academic support services for all Yellow Jacket student-athletes. Other projects, such as a new stadium for the softball team, are underway.

Named Georgia Tech's Director of Athletics on February 22, 2006, Radakovich possesses nearly two decades of experience in collegiate athletics management positions. He came to Georgia Tech after five years as senior associate athletics director at Louisiana State (2001-06), and he previously served as the athletics director at American University in Washington, D.C., in 2000-01. That followed stints as associate athletics director at South Carolina (1994-2000) and Long Beach State (1989-94) as well as two years as the athletics business manager at Miami (1983-85).

Just the seventh Director of Athletics in Tech history, Radakovich was named by Institute President Dr. Wayne Clough to succeed Dave Braine, who retired after nearly nine years in the post. Radakovich also follows in the footsteps of storied names such as John Heisman, Bobby Dodd and Homer Rice.

"Dan Radakovich brings a unique combination of enthusiasm for sports, concern for student athletes, experience in athletic administration, business experience and communication skills that are needed in today's complex world of intercollegiate athletics," said Dr. Clough.

In his position at LSU, Radakovich was responsible for the day-to-day operation of an athletics program with an annual budget of more than \$50 million, encompassing 20 sports and more than 450 student-athletes. He directly supervised LSU's men's basketball and baseball programs.

Early in his tenure, Radakovich was instrumental in developing LSU's football ticket donation program which resulted in more than \$9 million in new annual revenue. He also participated with the Tiger Athletic Foundation in the most ambitious capital improvement initiative in school history, including a \$90 million renovation of the Tigers' historic football stadium.

LSU athletics reached unparalleled heights during his tenure, highlighted by the 2003 national championship in football and the basketball team's berth in the 2006 NCAA Final Four, as well as national titles in men's and women's track and field and top five national rankings in baseball, women's basketball, softball and gymnastics.

As associate athletics director at South Carolina, Radakovich directed financial operations for a \$30 million athletics budget.

At Long Beach State, where he served as senior associate athletics director from 1989-94, Radakovich managed a \$5 million budget and supervised the men's basketball and baseball programs.

Radakovich began his career in athletics administration as the athletics business manager at Miami from 1983-85. He then worked in the private sector for four years before moving to Long Beach State in 1989.

A graduate of Center High School near Aliquippa, Pa., and a member of its Alumni Hall of Fame, Radakovich, 49, became a football letterwinner and student coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, where he graduated in 1980 with a Bachelor of Science degree in finance. He will be enshrined into the Beaver County Sports Hall of Fame later this year.

Radakovich added a master's degree in business administration from Miami in 1982. He also completed the Sports Management Institute's executive education program in 1992.

He is married to the former Marcie McDonald, and the couple has two children, Christian, 17, and Grant, 13.

She relinguished her coaching duties following the 2005 season, when she was promoted to Associate Athletics Director

Wenzel spent three years (1994-97) as an assistant women's basketball coach at Canisus College in Buffalo, N.Y., and she also served an internship with the National Invitational Tournament.

A basketball letterwinner at Marquette University, Wenzel earned a Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from Marquette in 1991. She added a master's degree in sport administration from Canisius in 2000.

Kloehs was head athletic trainer at Houston Baptist University from 2000-02. There he oversaw all medical coverage


for men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball and volleyball.

THE TRADITION

Consistency. It is the mark of true excellence in any endeavor.

However, in today's intercollegiate athletics, competition has become so balanced and so competitive that it is virtually impossible to maintain a high level of consistency.

Yet the Atlantic Coast Conference has defied the odds. Now in its 55th year of competition, the ACC has long enjoyed the reputation as one of the strongest and most competitive intercollegiate conferences in the nation. And that is not mere conjecture, the numbers support it.

Since the league's inception in 1953, ACC schools have captured 105 national championships, including 56 in women's competition and 49 in men's. In addition, NCAA individual titles have gone to ACC student-athletes 139 times in men's competition and 86 times in women's action.

THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The conference will conduct championship competition in 24 sports during the 2007-08 academic year - 12 for men and 12 for women.

The first ACC championship was held in swimming on February 25, 1954. The conference did not conduct championships in cross country, wrestling or tennis during the first

year.

The 12 sports for men include football, cross country, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, wrestling, baseball, tennis, golf and lacrosse. Fencing, which was started in 1971, was discontinued in 1981.

Women's sports were initiated in 1977 with the first championship meet being held in tennis at Wake Forest University.

Championships for women are currently conducted in cross country, field hockey, soccer, basketball, swimming, indoor and outdoor track, tennis, golf, lacrosse, softball and rowing.

A HISTORY

The Atlantic Coast Conference was founded on May 8, 1953, at the Sedgefield Inn near Greensboro, N.C., with seven charter members - Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, North Carolina State, South Carolina and Wake Forest - drawing up the conference by-laws.

The withdrawal of seven schools from the Southern Conference came early on the morning of May 8, 1953, during the Southern Conference's annual spring meeting. On June 14, 1953, the seven members met in Raleigh, N.C., where a set of bylaws was adopted and the name became officially the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Suggestions from fans for the name of the new conference appeared in the region's newspapers prior to the meeting in Raleigh. Some of the names suggested were: Dixie, Mid South, Mid Atlantic, East Coast, Seaboard, Colonial, Tobacco, Blue-Gray, Piedmont, Southern Seven and the Shoreline.

Duke's Eddie Cameron recommended that the name of the conference be the Atlantic Coast Conference, and the motion was passed unanimously. The meeting concluded with each member institution assessed \$200.00 to pay for conference expenses.

On December 4, 1953, conference officials met again at Sedgefield and officially admitted the University of Virginia as the league's eighth member. The first, and only, withdrawal of a school from the ACC came on June 30, 1971, when the University of South Carolina tendered its resignation.

The ACC operated with seven members until April 3, 1978, when the Georgia Institute of Technology was admitted. The Atlanta school had withdrawn from the Southeastern Conference in January of 1964.

The ACC expanded to nine members on July 1, 1991, with the addition of Florida State University.

The conference expanded to 11 members on July 1, 2004, with the addition of the University of Miami and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. On October 17, 2003, Boston College accepted an invitation to become the league's 12th member starting July 1, 2005.

N.C. STATE — Charter member of the Southern Conference in 1921; charter member of the ACC in 1953.

VIRGINIA — Charter member of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association in 1894; charter member of the Southern Conference in 1921; resigned from Southern Conference in December 1936; joined the ACC in December, 1953.

VIRGINIA TECH — Charter member of the Southern Conference in 1921; withdrew from the Southern Conference in June, 1965; became a charter member of the Big East Football Conference in Feb. 5, 1991; joined the ACC in July, 2004.

2008 GEORGIA TECH TRACK & FIELD

Kathy Harrison

HISTORY



GEORGIA TECH fielded its first track and field team in 1986 under the direction of Dee Todd. Tech started the program with nearly 20 athletes on its squad, led by Kathy Harrison of Atlanta. In the Yellow Jackets first year of competition, Tech tallied 28 points and finished in sixth place in the league standings. Even more amazing was the fact that Tech's Harrison scored all 28 points as she finished either second or third in four different events.

Tech hosted the Outdoor Atlantic Coast Conference Championships on April 15-18, 1987 at the new George C. Griffin Track. The Jackets welcomed Clemson, Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, NC State, Virginia and Wake Forest in its first opportunity to host an event since joining the league in 1979.

In 1987, Virginia became the first ACC school to clinch both indoor and outdoor conference titles. UVA won the inaugural indoor ACC meet with 132 points. Tech finished fifth that season, totaling 35 points. Harrison was tabbed ACC Meet Most Valuable Performer after winning the long jump.

In 2002, the Rambling Wreck reached a milestone as the Jackets captured the first ACC track and field championship men's or women's - under the direction of head coach Alan Drosky. The Jackets outscored nine-time defending champion North Carolina, 122-113, in UNC's new Eddie Smith Field House.



In the modern era, Tech has become a force on both the conference and national scenes. The Yellow Jackets have finished in the top-three at the conference meet 10 times in the last 10 years. Tech has also posted four consecutive top-25 finishes at the NCAA Championships during the indoor and outdoor seasons of 2004 and '05.

Chaunte Howard became the first athlete to win three consecutive national titles, posting her third in the high jump at the 2005 NCAA Indoor Championships with a school record-tying mark of 6 feet, 3.50 inches. Howard finished her career with six consecutive ACC high jump titles and garnered six All-America honors during her three seasons. Howard also became the first athlete to compete in the Summer Olympic Games, finishing in a tie for 28th at the 2004 Athens Olympics and went on to earn a Silver medal at the 10th IAAF World Championships in Helsinki, Finland, in 2005.

The Jackets have had 16 All-America performances at the last four NCAA Outdoor Championships in 2004, '05, '06 and '07 and finished an outdoor program-best tie for 15th place at the 2004 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

DEE TODD (1985-88)

Todd joined the Georgia Tech staff in August, 1985, to become the first women's head coach for track and cross country teams. In her initial season, Todd guided Tech to a sixth-place finish at the Outdoor ACC Championships, coaching two-time All-ACC perform-

ers Kathy Harrison (track) and Bridget Koster (cross country). Todd was later recognized by the league by being named ACC Coach of the Year in 1987.

After coaching for three seasons at Tech, Todd left the Yellow Jackets to take over as assistant commisioner at the Atlantic Coast Conference.

During her tenure, Tech posted three top-five finishes at the Indoor ACC Championships and two straight top-four finishes at the Outdoor ACC Championships. Harrison won four ACC titles, two All-America honors and was the first Jacket to qualify for the NCAA Championships.

BUDDY FOWLKES (1989-92)

The Director of Georgia Tech Track and Field, Buddy Fowlkes oversaw the women's track and field team for four seasons. During that time, Fowlkes guided the Jackets to four consecutive top-five finishes at the indoor and outdoor ACC Championships.



Under Fowlkes' watch, Natasha Alleyne

became the first national champion in program history. Alleyne won the 1992 indoor high jump with a then-school record mark of 6'2.50".

That same season, the Yellow Jackets tallied their highest indoor finish ever at a NCAA Championship meet, posting a seventh-place finish in Indianapolis, Ind. Tech finished in a tie for 29th place at the Outdoor NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas.

WENDY TRUVILLION (1993-95)

Truvillion took over the reigns as head coach of the Tech program in 1993. During her stint, she tutored five All-Americans, 13 ACC champions and 14 All-ACC honorees.



Nelrae Pasha and Janeen Jones earned a total of five All-America honors and six ACC titles between them under Truvillion's direction.

ALAN DROSKY (1995-PRESENT)

A two-time ACC Coach of the Year, Alan Drosky has brought the women's track program into the spotlight in his 12 seasons as head coach. The former Tech All-American and Hall of Fame inductee, took over the program in 1995.



On the national scene, Drosky guided the Jackets to five consecutive top-25 finishes at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships. His athletes have earned 23 All-America honors during that span, including a record-tying seven at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

At the conference level, Drosky has led the Jackets to 10 top-three finishes in the last nine years, including the program's first ACC title in 2002.

During his tenure, Tech athletes have earned four national titles, 64 All-America honors, 82 ACC titles and 161 All-ACC honors.



GEORGE C. GRIFFIN TRACK

Home of the 2008 ACC Outdoor Track & Field Championships

The George C. Griffin Track and Field Facility, already considered one of the top sites in the Southeast for outdoor collegiate track competition, was improved as part of Georgia Tech's preparation for the Centennial Olympic Games.

Griffin Track was renovated with a state-of-the-art Mondo surface, similar to those used at Olympic Stadiums and at the sites of the World Championship, U.S. Track and Field Indoor Championships and NCAA Outdoor Championships.

The track was the workout track for the Olympic Village, which offered Tech the opportunity to renovate its facilities.

Fifteen Griffin Track records (eight women's and seven men's marks) were set at the 1996 Georgia Tech-Reebok Invitational, the first event held on the new surface.

The Georgia Tech track team's locker rooms were also renovated as part of the \$10 million re-creation of the Alexander Memorial Coliseum, which served as the boxing venue during the Games.

In addition to Griffin Track's state of the art surface and locker rooms, the facility is enhanced by a scenic location, which combines natural beauty with Atlanta's modern skyline. The eight-lane, ultramodern Griffin Track is located between Tech's Rose Bowl practice football fields and the Bill Moore Tennis Center on Fowler Street.



Griffin Track was originally built in the summer of 1985 and remains one of the few tracks in the United States that meet international standards.

The facility is named after national Hall of Fame coach George C. Griffin, who guided both the Yellow Jacket track and cross country programs from 1921-25 and 1934-43 and remained the cross country coach until 1974.

The Tech track and field program experienced unprecedented success during the Griffin era, winning six Southeastern Athletic Association Championships and one Southeastern Conference Championship.

Griffin also guided the cross country team to new heights, winning 10 SEC titles, including six in a row from 1935-40.

Two of Griffin's athletes competed in the Olympic Games. Homer Welchel competed in the javelin in 1924, and Ed Hamm won a Gold medal and set a world record in the long jump in 1928.

"His service to amateur athletics as a track and cross country coach at Georgia Tech, and as a guiding force behind the Georgia AAU track meets, has established him as one of the State's most important figures in the promotion of physical fitness among our youth.

"Because of his great and sincere love of people, his unfailing sense of humor, and his ability to deal with others, he has become the best-known and most-loved personality in the 76-year history of the Georgia Institute of Technology."

MORRIS BRYAN STADIUM

Morris Bryan Stadium, which completes the George C. Griffin Track and Field Facility, provides the Rambling Wreck with the one of the finest total track and field complexes in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

The facilities at Morris Bryan Stadium include a 1,500-seat grandstand along with judges stands, a press box, concession stands, storage areas and restrooms.

The grandstands bring fans close to the action and give them an excellent view of the track as well as the Atlanta skyline.

The area around the track is magnificent, as you can see the Atlanta skyscrapers and the Tech Tower.

The stadium's namesake, the late Morris Bryan, is the former president of the Jefferson Mills.

A 1941 graduate of Georgia Tech, Bryan competed for three years as a hurdler on legendary coach George Griffin's track teams.

Bryan was widely known as the "Father of the Georgia Olympics," an all-classification state high school track and field championship meet that has been held in Jefferson, Ga., since 1972.

"The family and company wanted to make this a first-class facility," said Tom Bryan."We are highly honored to name the stadium in memory of my brother."

The stadium was officially dedicated when Tech hosted the ACC Outdoor Track and Field Championships for the first time in school history in April 1987.

A contribution from the Bryan family and Jefferson Mills in large part funded the building of the stadium.

Former Director of Track Buddy Fowlkes also solicited donations from Tech track and field alumni. Donors have had their names etched on a plaque and were honored at the dedication ceremony.

September 30, 1961 versus Rice. For the first time, the official Rambling Wreck car led the Georgia Tech football team onto Grant Field. It's happened at every home game since.

The event did not establish a new tradition at Georgia Tech, but it cemented one. The vehicle, a restored 1930 Model A Ford Sport Coupe, was Tech's first official Rambling Wreck car.

Since that time, the Rambling Wreck car has joined a much older tradition—the Yellow Jacket—as an official school mascot.

The term Rambling Wreck was first applied to a 1914 Ford owned by Floyd Field, Dean of Men. In the first published reference to the car as the "Rambling Wreck" in 1927, the Technique student newspaper spoke out against Field when he considered trading the car, but he did it anyway.

The Technique maintained the tradition with a yearly collegiate auto race from Atlanta to Athens, known as the "Old Ford" race or "Flying Flivver" race, which began in 1929 but was discontinued when it became too dangerous. In its place is the familiar Rambling Wreck Parade, which is still held every year at Homecoming. The event challenges students to produce outlandish "mechanical monstrosities" capable of traversing a short course on campus.

Tech officials decided in the late 1950s that the school needed an official car that would be known forever as the Rambling Wreck. Dean of Students James Dull began a search for a pre-1940 vintage model, and finally found one—parked in front of his apartment building. The owner, Capt. Ted J. Johnson, a Delta Air Lines pilot, had just finished restoring the 1930 Ford Cabriolet Sport Coupe, which he intended to give to his son as a gift.

Johnson decided to let Tech have the car for \$1,000 in May, 1961. He later returned the purchase price in the form of a contribution to the Alexander-Tharpe Fund, fulfilling a desire to go on record as having given the Rambling Wreck to Georgia Tech.

THE YELLOW JACKET

Conflicting accounts exist as to the origins and beginnings of the Yellow Jacket, but the nickname did not grow out of the familiar six-legged insect; rather, the insect mascot, known as "Buzz," grew out of the nickname. The first known reference to Tech students as "Yellowjackets" appeared in the Atlanta Constitution in 1905 and came into common usage at that time. The name, spelled as one word, was first used to describe supporters who attended Tech athletic events, dressed in yellow coats and jackets. The actual mascot was conceived at a later, undetermined date.

Other nicknames which have applied to Tech teams include the Engineers; the Tecks, the first known nickname which was phased out around 1910; the Blacksmiths, common between 1902 and 1904; and the Golden Tornado , thought to be created by sportswriters when John Heisman led Tech to its first national title in 1917.

TRADITION

THE RAMBLIN' WRECK FIGHT SONG

The Georgia Tech fight song grew out of an old folk ballad, "The Sons of the Gamboliers."

Howard D. Cutter, a member of Tech's first graduating class (Mechanical Engineering, 1892), wrote in the November-December 1942 issue of the Georgia Tech Alumnus that the "Ramblin'Wreck" had its origins during the first two years after Tech opened in 1888, inspired when the entire student body traveled to Athens to see Tech's baseball team defeat Georgia.

By the early 1900s, "Ramblin'Wreck" was an established tradition. The earliest existing published version of the song appeared in the Blueprint, the Institute's yearbook, in 1908.

In 1910, Michael A. Greenblatt, Tech's first bandmaster, discovered the band playing "Ramblin' Wreck" to the tune of "Sons of the Gamboliers," and made his first arrangement of the song in the form of a handwritten manuscript.

When Frank Roman succeeded Greenblatt as bandmaster in 1911, he wrote a new adaptation of "Ramblin' Wreck," accompanied by many trumpet flourishes, that became nationally known. His is the version that continues to be popular today.

The fame of the song spread to such proportions that, in 1959, it was sung by Richard Nixon and Nikita Khrushchev at their historic face-to-face meeting in Moscow.

In 1984, the law firm of Newton, Hopkins & Ormsby investigated the copyright of "Ramblin'Wreck" and found that a number of people have had various versions of the song copyrighted. The original version of the song is in the public domain and can be played without payment of royalties.

In the fall of 1891, before Georgia Tech organized a football team of its own, a game was scheduled between Auburn and Georgia. A rivalry was already established in baseball between Tech and Georgia, so Tech students were invited to the game to cheer, of course, for Auburn.

The students appointed a committee to recommend colors to be worn and cheers to be used at the game. The committee suggested white and gold, and about 200 students attended the game wearing those colors.

In 1893, when Georgia Tech's football team played Georgia for the first time, a group of young women from the Lucy Cobb Institute for Girls attended the game to cheer for Tech, dressed in white and gold.

Oh well it's up with the White and Gold Down with the Red and Black Georgia Tech is out for the victory We'll drop the battle axe on Georgia's head When we meet her, our team is sure to beat her Down on the old farm there will be no sound Till our bow-wows rip through the air When the battle is over, Georgia's team will be found With the Yellow Jackets swarming around.

Through this multifaceted program, the brainchild of retired Director of Athletics Dr. Homer Rice, Rambling Wreck student-athletes have the opportunity to learn the elements of success beyond the classroom or playing field. They gain skills that remain with them for a lifetime, preparing for the career and personal challenges ahead.

During his 17-year tenure from 1980–97, Rice rebuilt Georgia Tech's athletic fortunes with an emphasis not just in fund-raising and facilities but in equally important areas such as academic support and life skills.

Since Rice started the Total Person Program in 1980, it has developed into the most comprehensive student-athlete support system in the country. Rice's model has been adopted nationwide as the foundation for the NCAA's Life Skills Program.

Addressing virtually every area of a well-rounded educational experience, the Total Person Program, under the direction of Rob Skinner, focuses on the following components:

HOMER RICE CENTER FOR SPORTS PERFORMANCE

Georgia Tech's Homer Rice Center for Sports Performance is a unique facility for testing and improving performance.

The Homer Rice Center focuses on six components: sports physiology, nutrition, sports medicine, psychology, motion analysis and vision.

Opened in 1996, the \$8 million facility also includes the Howard Candler, Jr., Football Conference Center and the George W. Mathews, Jr., Athletic Heritage Center.

The Yellow Jacket track & field teams participate in community outreach with other teams from Tech, including the Toy Drive.
