

Open Politics??

Those students who did not attend the so called "Open Political" meeting in the Chapel Monday night missed what might be called one of the greatest events that has occurred on the Tech campus in a long

The original object of this meeting, or the object which some of the unsuspecting attendants had in mind, was to select men for class offices so that the students should know something about what was going on. But the originators of the movement were far from this point of view by the time they arrived at the meeting. The Technique, which has been completely unbiased on the subject of politics up to now, was questioned from every angle by the chairman of the meeting and his colleagues on the speakers platform. It seemed that the speakers were trying to lead the students to believe the Technique was working against the students to believe the Technique was working against the students leave the meeting if he did not think the same as the members on the speakers platform.

One of the main speakers and one of the men on the speakers platform who was continually disrupting the meeting was, last year, and still is the leader of one of the present political parties. When one of the

most prominent students in school got up to speak, this person on the platform expressed himself as saying he had never heard of the student before, although he is a member of the Student Council, Anak, and ODK. It is indeed a disappointment to see such a person on the speaker's platform and one that poses as a leader of one of the political parties who seems to know so little about really outstanding students and important school activities.

It seemed as if the meeting was more for the members of the Independent party and their supporters than it was for the student body as a whole as it had been previously exercised. Many prominent students were not permitted by the supporters that the seeding of students as well as persons from the speaking of students as well as persons from the speaking of students as well as persons from the speakers platform; all outbursts and anything obnoxious to the speakers being tolerated by the chairman who would let any of his cronies talk but made it as hard as possible on the opposition.

It seemed that the political group further condemned their project by attacking the Student Council and ODK, as well as the Technique. When a group of men let one man get up and speak for them against such well established student activities it certainly is a test of their integrity.

The group further brought doom to their plan when they edited one of those "fly by night" booklets which is a regular occurrence now. The booklet entirely misrepresents the action of the Student Council on matters pertaining to the coming election. It also said a platform would be drawn up and the men nominated so the students could know what they stood for. At the meeting no platform was mentioned and some of the men nominated were not even present at the meeting.

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
