What is one of your biggest accomplishments?



Georgia Tech 2010 Waste Diversion Statistics

The graph below shows a comparison of the recyclable, compostable, and reusable materials collected on Georgia Tech's Atlanta campus in 2009 and 2010. The most dramatic increases are for mixed metals and composting. The rise in mixed metals recycling is due in large part to a renovation project at GTRI's Cobb County facility. GT Dining's food waste composting program, which was implemented in 2009, saw a dramatic expansion in 2010.

Question: How do I request recycling containers at a special event that I am hosting?



Answer: If you have an event at which you would like to have temporary recycling containers, you can request these containers on our <u>Special Events form</u>. The service is free! Make sure you submit the request at least a week ahead of time so that we have time to prepare for delivering, setting up and collecting the containers in time for your event. This is a free service, so don't hesitate to submit your request!
