This month we interviewed Ms. Judy Fitzpatrick. She is a Project Support Analyst at GTRI. Ms. Fitzpatrick has been with GA Tech for 19 years and retired August 31, 2006. During her extensive career with GA Tech Ms. Fitzpatrick also served as the Recycling Contact Person for CRB, and was a member of the Earth Day committee for several years.

We asked Ms. Fitzpatrick the following:

Tell us about your environmental contribution: I recycle just about everything!

Student Move In



GA Tech has had another successful student move in! Over many days hundreds of freshmen, and returning students, moved into campus housing. With them they brought many boxes full of clothes, food, computers, and more. Every year the Recycling office establishes temporary collection sites for students to deposit their used boxes. This year there were 16 locations throughout campus to capture all of the cardboard that would have been put in the paper recycling. All of the cardboard collected will be recycled and used to make new boxes. Over a one week period we collected 16,160 pounds, or 8.08 tons, of cardboard.

The cardboard recycling sites were only available for one short week, but don't think that you can't recycle cardboard on campus because they are gone. We also accept cardboard at our <u>two main recycling sites</u> (by O'Keefe and ULC/Woodruff South), as well as in several buildings on campus. Office of Solid Waste Management & Recycling Services

The Office of Solid Waste Management & Recycling (OSWM&R) provides many services to the GA Tech community. You may already know that students receive blue recycling containers in their dorms when they move in, staff members are provided a desk side containers, and temporary containers are provided to faculty during events and when they are relocating. But did you know that OSWM&R also provides recycling services beyond these?

On campus there are many recycling opportunities. There are two main recycling sites (by O'Keefe and ULC/Woodruff South) that are available to all faculty, staff and students. You can recycle aluminum cans, plastic bottles (1 & 2), newsprint, mixed office paper, magazines, cardboard, and glass (clear, green and brown). These sites are commonly used by students that live off-campus or faculty and staff members that do not have comprehensive recycling programs in their neighborhoods. There are also 11 satellite recycling stations on campus where you can recycle cans, plastic bottles and newsprint. These locations are conveniently located along common walking paths which provide easy access.

During this school year if you have questions about recyclable materials, recycling locations, or if you have a special request, please contact our <u>office</u>. Our goal is to have 100% participation from the entire GA Tech community!
