This idea of *incidental infrastructure* – *incidental urbanism* is not exactly new. The Ponte Vecchio is one example. The oldest bridge across the widest part of the River Arno enabled a boisterous city street to be built on top of it and then enabled the secret passage, the Vasari Corridor leading from the Palace to the Uffizzi, to be built on top of that, which then enabled the back-shops to be added by projecting them over the river. And others: The Spanish Steps – the Piazza di Spangna - in Rome; Rockefeller Center in Manhattan. Urban projects must do more than one thing: a bridge is more than a bridge, steps are more than steps, and a building is more than just a building.

TENTH STREET PARK-BRIDGE

Tenth Street is a tough street. It's busy, hostile to pedestrians, topographically odd, blazing hot in the summer and freezing in the winter. It's the old Peachtree to the highway. Tenth Street has narrow sidewalks, congested traffic, no sidewalks, and buildings that make no contribution to the life of the street. The street needs to be torn out and replaced by Georgia Tech students and faculty visitors to athletic events. Former athletes, former coaches, former fans, and the growing number of Maltrow residents who could walk to work or for athletic events. Tenth Street from Georgia Tech to West Peachtree needs to be replaced. Small firms won't work. Tenth Street is so bad, you should drive it.

This project proposes to take the **Terth Street** with a linear **Park-bridge** as infrastructure to support new high-density development along both sides of the street. To a lower level—the Terth Street sidewalk would be widened with new buildings set back with retail shops and restaurants facing parking decks to the rear. An mezzanine level would be a park—actually a series of gardens designed by different architects, landscape architects and artists—forming an arcade space over the highway. This park or series of gardens would become the new bridge across the highway one level above the existing bridge and ending in new buildings near or connected to the Coliseum. The **Terth Street Park-bridge** is infrastructure for new development, a way to cross the highway at Terth, and a new park for Midtown, for Atlanta, and for Georgia Tech.
