Introduction

The Research Career Development Award provided by the grant supported me during the period of August, 1985 through July, 1990. The RCDA has certainly contributed to the advancement of my career. I began the award period as an Associate Professor of Psychology. My promotion to Professor of Psychology has been approved by the Dean of the College of Sciences and is currently under administrative review. The release from teaching responsibilities I received enabled me to run two R01 research grants, also funded by the National Institute on Aging, and to generate a tremendous amount of interesting data on fundamental questions regarding individual differences in cognition in adult populations.
