- From June 25-27, we will have an intern from the Georgia Archives Institute. She is Amy Summerlin from Berry College. Amy is the technical assistant in the archives at Berry College. She is interested in learning more about archival practices all around.
- A little Library history from Laura Hammond Papers, Georgia Tech Librarian, 1905-1924:

Speaking before the Georgia Library Association in 1910, Georgia Tech librarian Laura Hammond shared the following statistics: at the time, as many as 150 students were in the library (25% of the enrollment at that time), with monthly attendance ranging from 3371 to 4781; the book collection numbered 6000 volumes, with an average daily circulation of 21. She went on to say, "...we have endeavored to build up our library on broad lines, for we believe that it must be above all 'a place for directing the student to the one great task of humanity, the task of human development & human betterment,' and that by the Library we are brought into touch with the best that man has done in every department of human activity."

# Meeting Minutes from May 1, 2002 Staff Meeting: (submitted by Sharon West)

#### **Recent Evaluations**

- Overall the implementation of the Evaluation Plans this year went well.
- There is a interest in having more definitive performance measures so that everyone has a clear understanding of what satisfies each level/indicator.

• Staff were assured that the Evaluation Plans would continue to evolve to incorporate more definitive performance standards; Rich has expressed a need to have such measures in place.

#### **Staff Awards**

- Thanks went out to everyone who made this year's process a success- committee members, nominators, nominees, administrative liaisons and financial supporters.
- Everyone was encouraged to consider participating on the 2002 2003 Staff Awards Committee beginning in the Fall. Updated guidelines with greater clarity will be placed on the intranet once the committee has been established.
- The selection process was discussed. The committee considered the content of the submissions opposed to the form or the number of nominations received per individual; each committee member read each submission; the Personnel Administrator remained neutral in the voting process but provided feedback on the nominations and the substance of the same.
- Everyone was encouraged to make a nomination next year- one nomination per person but not exclusive to their respective service area i.e. someone in Public Service can nominate someone in either of the three service areas- Administrative, Public, or Technical.
- Concern was voiced about having to submit a narrative which may have had an adverse effect on the number of nominations received. Clarification was given with indication that submissions do not have to be several pages or even paragraphs, but the substance of what is submitted will have an effect on the potential outcome- the award recipients. All nominations should fully substantiate the nominee as being honorable/worthy of recognition for their contributions to the Library, service, professional development, exemplary performance/conduct, etc. The word "narrative" will be substituted with "supporting statement" in the updated guidelines in an effort to alleviate a potential impediment.

# **Staff Activity Committee**

- Accolades went out to the Staff Activity Committee for the fine lead they have taken in providing opportunities for everyone in the Library to participate in beneficial and rewarding activities.
- The Staff Activity Committee gave details of the Health Fair.

# **Unit Representation**

- Staff members were informed that the idea of having unit representatives was recommended.
- Staff members raised no opposition to the idea but indicated they do not want unit representation in lieu of quarterly staff meetings.
- It was recommended that unit reps would be solicited and will perhaps meet bi-monthly, and we will continue to have quarterly staff meetings.

### ETC.

- Kirby Johnson was introduced as a new staff member in the Systems Dept.
- Student Assistant recognition rewards were distributed on May 1.
- Process for making training requests briefly discussed- a consistent process is desirable.
- The meeting time was discussed with recommendations to change it to 3pm or alternate between 2pm and 3pm meeting times to allow those who work a later shift an opportunity to attend. It was decided that as a compromise the meeting time would be changed to 2:30 to accommodate those who come in the afternoon and those who leave before 4pm.
