We're enjoying a time of tremendous momentum:

Engineered Biosystems Building (EBB): When it opens in June 2015, it will significantly impact Georgia's economy by driving innovation; commercializing new devices, drugs, and technologies; forming new companies; and creating high-skill, high-paying jobs.

Tech Square: Last month, Home Depot joined our already strong lineup of innovation centers in Tech Square. It will take advantage of their location on campus by hiring Georgia Tech students and graduates, identifying joint research areas, and engaging faculty in employee development. NCR also recently announced that it will be moving from the suburbs to Tech Square.

High Performance Computing Center (HPCC): Across the street from Georgia Tech Hotel. With about 600,000 square feet, it will be 20 to 27 stories high, and Georgia Tech will use about one-third of it to house its state-of-the-art research computing.

Campaign Georgia Tech: Met its goal a year early, but pressing on to meet some specific goals. We're getting close to our goal of establishing 100 endowed chairs. We'll be concentrating on helping individual schools reach their fund-raising goals.

Georgia Tech alumni are in the public eye, nationally and internationally. We're excited that two of them will be featured speakers at our Commencement ceremonies in May. Former Georgia Tech President Dr. Wayne Clough, who in his most recent position served as the Smithsonian Institution secretary, will address the Friday-night session. And General Philip Breedlove, the Supreme Commander of NATO, will speak at the Saturday-afternoon session.

It's really a great Commencement lineup this year. Although he's not an alumnus, Arne Duncan, the U.S. secretary of education, will speak at the Saturday-morning session.

We are very grateful that you remain engaged and that you honor the Institute with your time, your gifts, and your service. Georgia Tech could not function at the high level it does without you.
