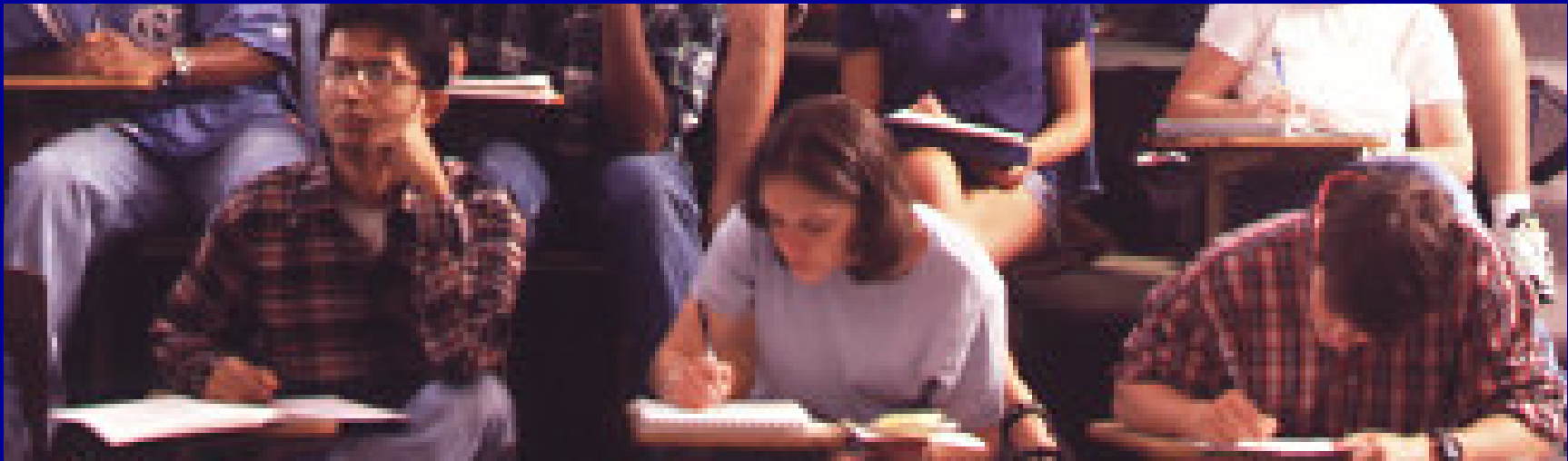
- Annual report in mail.

- AE senior Karen Feigh, Tech's third British Marshall Scholar; one finalist in Truman competition.



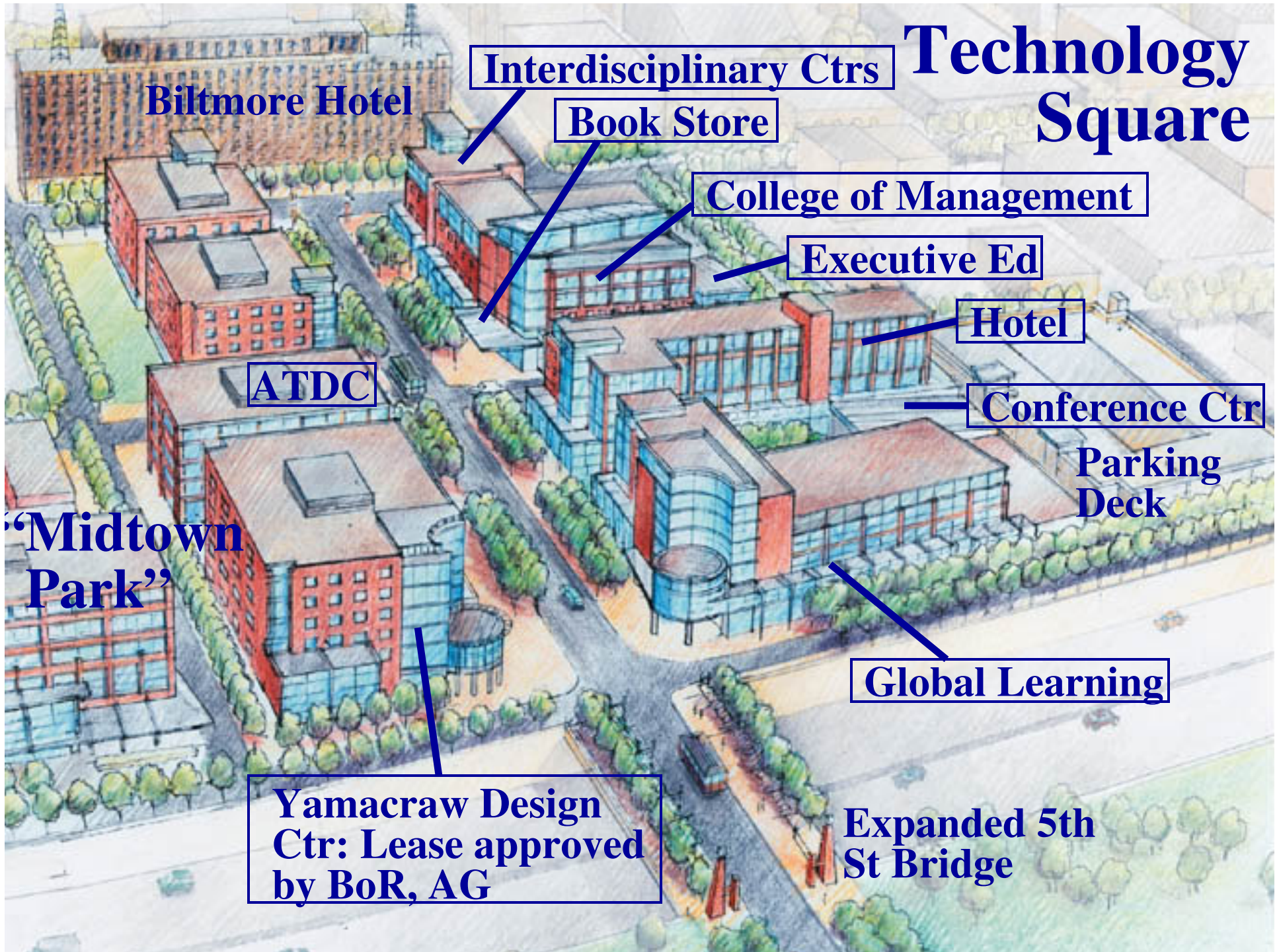
# Faculty

## Supplemental Budget:

- Design funds for ACTB
- \$5 m for GTREP building in Savannah
- \$250,000 for ATDC consulting
- GRA (3 Eminent Scholars), Yamacraw
- Hold harmless funding for System

## 2002 Budget:

- 4.5% salary increase
- “Workload” funding
- GTREP faculty support, 2 PS institutes
- Funding equalization for cont. ed.
